LD 183 An Act To Establish Juneteenth as a Paid State Holiday (Talbot Ross)

SUMMARY

This bill establishes June 19th of each year as Juneteenth and as a state holiday (Title 5, §59). As with other state holidays, nonessential state offices are closed. This bill also adds Juneteenth as a holiday for the Judiciary (Title 4, §1051), banks and financial institutions (Title 9-B, §145) and elementary and secondary education institutions (Title 20-A, §4802).
