1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	<b>Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §12501, sub-§2, ¶B,</b> as enacted by PL 2003, c. 414, Pt. A, §2 and affected by c. 614, §9, is amended to read:
4	B. A nonresident fishing license to a nonresident $\frac{12}{16}$ years of age or older.
5 6	Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §12501, sub-§5, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 414, Pt. A, §2 and affected by c. 614, §9, is repealed.
7 8	Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §12501, sub-§6, ¶D, as amended by PL 2009, c. 213, Pt. OO, §11, is repealed.
9 10	<b>Sec. 4. 12 MRSA §12503, sub-§1,</b> as enacted by PL 2003, c. 414, Pt. A, §2 and affected by c. 614, §9, is amended to read:
11 12	<b>1. Resident and nonresident under 16.</b> A resident <u>and nonresident</u> under 16 years of age <del>and a nonresident under 12 years of age</del> may fish without a license.
13	SUMMARY
14 15 16	This bill eliminates the requirement for a general nonresident junior fishing license for youths 12 years of age or older and under 16 years of age, so that all youths under the age of 16 do not need a fishing license, whether they are a resident or not.
