1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	<b>Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1511, sub-§6,</b> as amended by PL 2011, c. 617, §1, is further amended to read:
4 5	<b>6. Health promotion purposes.</b> Allocations are limited to the following prevention and health promotion purposes:
6 7	A. Smoking prevention, cessation and control activities, including, but not limited to, reducing smoking among the children of the State;
8 9	A-1. Prevention, education and treatment activities concerning unhealthy weight and obesity;
10 11	B. Prenatal and young children's care including home visits and support for parents of children from birth to 6 years of age;
12	C. Child care for children up to 15 years of age, including after-school care;
13 14	D. Health care for children and adults, maximizing to the extent possible federal matching funds;
15 16	E. Prescription drugs for adults who are elderly or disabled, maximizing to the extent possible federal matching funds;
17 18	F. Dental and oral health care to low-income persons who lack adequate dental coverage;
19	G. Substance abuse prevention and treatment; and
20 21	H. Comprehensive school health and nutrition programs, including school-based health centers.
22 23 24	Funding allocated pursuant to paragraphs A, A-1, B, C, D, F, G and H may not be decreased in subsequent unified current services budget legislation or deallocated in supplemental budget legislation in order to reduce a budget deficit.
25	SUMMARY
26 27	This bill amends the law on the Fund for a Healthy Maine to require that funding for children's health care not be reduced in order to address a budget deficit.
