## 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §1251, sub-§1, ¶E, as enacted by PL 2005, c. 314, §6, is
amended to read:

- 4 E. With <u>Unless a permit is issued pursuant to subsection 7, with</u> a license issued by 5 this State that expired within the previous 90 days. Violation of this paragraph is a 6 traffic infraction.
- 7 Sec. 2. 29-A MRSA §1251, sub-§7 is enacted to read:

7. Temporary permit to operate a motor vehicle with an expired license. Upon
stopping an operator of a motor vehicle who is in violation of subsection 1, paragraph E,
a law enforcement officer may issue a permit to the operator of the motor vehicle to
operate the motor vehicle to the operator's residence or to an office of the bureau for the
sole purpose of renewing the operator's license.

14 This bill allows a law enforcement officer to issue a permit to a person whose 15 operator's license has expired within the previous 90 days to allow that person to drive to 16 the operator's residence or to an office of the Department of the Secretary of State, 17 Bureau of Motor Vehicles for the sole purpose of renewing the operator's license.
