The amendment requires that the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Board of Pesticides 4 5 Control award an annual grant of not less than \$135,000 each April 1st to the University 6 of Maine Cooperative Extension for development and implementation of integrated pest 7 management programs.
