An expanded function dental assistant <u>auxiliary</u> shall perform under the direct supervision of a dentist. As used in this section, "direct supervision" means that a dentist is in the dental office or treatment facility, personally diagnoses the condition to be treated, personally authorizes the condition to be treated and remains in the dental office or treatment facility while the procedure is being performed by the expanded function dental assistant <u>auxiliary</u> and, before dismissal of the patient, evaluates the work performed by the expanded function dental assistant <u>auxiliary</u>.

### §1098-E. Temporary filling procedures; atraumatic restorative technique

A dental hygienist with public health supervision status, as defined by rules adopted by the Board of Dental Examiners, may perform temporary filling procedures without a dentist present under protocols developed by the Board of Dental Examiners. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

12 In addition to temporary filling procedures, a dental hygienist with public health 13 supervision status who successfully completes additional training established by the 14 board may perform atraumatic restorative technique. For the purposes of this paragraph, 15 "atraumatic restorative technique" means a procedure to identify and remove tooth decay 16 using a simple hand tool alone and restore the cavity with an adhesive restorative 17 material.

Dental auxiliaries include, but are not limited to, dental hygienists, independent practice dental hygienists, dental assistants, expanded function dental <u>assistants <u>auxiliaries</u></u>, dental laboratory technicians and denturists.

**SUMMARY** 

34 This amendment is the minority report of the committee. It replaces the bill and 35 broadens the scope of practice for dental hygienists with public health supervision status and independent practice dental hygienists who have successfully completed additional 36 training established by the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Board 37 of Dental Examiners to include the performance of atraumatic restorative technique. It 38 defines "atraumatic restorative technique" to mean a procedure to identify and remove 39 tooth decay using a simple hand tool alone and restore the cavity with an adhesive 40 restorative material. It also changes the designation of expanded function dental 41

assistants to "expanded function dental auxiliary" and broadens their scope of practice,
 which currently includes the performance of reversible intraoral procedures, to include
 the cementation of permanent crowns and onlays, the administering of final impressions
 and the performance of digital imaging under the direct supervision of a licensed dentist.
