1 2	Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and		
3 4	Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and		
5 6 7	Whereas, federal funding to support HIV prevention training and education for school health educators and special education teachers in Maine ended as of August 31, 2013; and		
8 9	Whereas, the training and education have been highly successful and have contributed to the State's low incidence rate of HIV; and		
10 11 12 13	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
