#### SUMMARY

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13 This amendment reallocates the language from the bill that creates the Office of 14 Policy Innovation and the Future into the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 310 15 instead of enacting a new chapter. It repeals Title 5, section 3108, leaving the office 16 subject to the Freedom of Access Act.

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
