Testimony in Support of LD 2096 An Act to Ensure Access to Nonopioid, Nonnarcotic Medication for Acute Pain Relief

Sponsored by President Troy Jackson February 13, 2024

Good afternoon, Senator Bailey, Representative Perry, and esteemed members of the Health Coverage, Insurance and Financial Services. My name is Charlotte Warren, and I am here on behalf of my client, the Alliance for Addiction and Mental Health Services. The Alliance is the statewide association representing the majority of Maine's community-based mental health and substance use treatment providers. The Alliance advocates for the implementation of sound policies and evidence-based practices that serve to enhance the quality and effectiveness of our behavioral health care system.

On behalf of the Alliance, I am here today to speak in support of LD 2096, "An Act to Ensure Access to Nonopioid, Nonnarcotic Medication for Acute Pain Relief." The Alliance thanks President Jackson for submitting this bill. As a social worker and former lawmaker who has been working with families and communities devastated by the opioid epidemic, this bill feels so important to our state. A significant portion of initial opioid use still begins with medications prescribed to treat serious, acute pain - such as from an accident or surgery. One of the key strategies for addressing the opioid epidemic is to prevent addiction in the first place and to protect against relapse for those stable and in recovery.

I cannot overstate the importance of this bill for those Mainers that are in recovery from substance misuse. For them, oral surgery or a skiing accident can put their entire rebuilt life at risk. But a pain medicine that doesn't contain opioids can help them heal in comfort without risking their recovery.

And for the thousands of Mainers who got hooked on opioids due to a prescription after a surgery or car accident, this proposal represents what for them could have changed the course of their entire life – never being prescribed that opioid in the first place.

Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony in support of LD 2096, An Act to Ensure Access to Nonopioid, Nonnarcotic Medication for Acute Pain Relief. Please vote ought to pass on this common sense legislation.
