Office of Secretary of State, Augusta, Maine, March 8, 1927. To the Senate and House of Repre-

sentative in Legislature assembled:

I have the honor to transmit herewith initiative petitions filed in the office of the Secretary of State on March 1, 2 and 3, 1927, proposing to the Legislature for its consideration, under the provisions of Article XXXI of the Constitution of Maine, a bill titled as follows:

An Act to Repeal Sections One to Thirty-Six of Chapter Six of the Revised Statutes Relative to Primary Elections.

Of said petitions 4 purporting to contain 239 names were filed March 1, 1927, 4 petitions purporting to contain 184 names were filed on March 2, 1927 and 1 petition purporting to contain 67 names was filed on March 3, 1927, as appears by the "Received" stamp on the back of said petitions.
