The Joint Standing Committee on Environment and Natural Resources reviewed the budget items in LD 100 that pertain to the agencies under the Committee's jurisdiction. The Committee's vote is reflected below and on the attached *Committee Budget Document* pages ENR-1 through ENR-7 and the *Committee Recommendation for Changes to Governor's Budget*.

1. <u>Proposed reductions in funding to JETCC, Saco River Corridor Commission and St. Croix International Waterway Commission.</u>

The 8 members present and voting do **not** support the proposed reductions in funding for the following agencies:

- JETCC \$79 proposed reduction (Ref #: 522 on page ENR-2)
- Saco River Corridor Commission \$466 proposed reduction (Ref #: 486 on page ENR-3)
- St. Croix International Waterway Commission \$217 proposed reduction (Ref #: 498, page ENR-4).

To offset our rejection of these proposals, the Committee recommends transferring an additional \$762 in unexpended funds from the Ground Water Oil Clean-up Fund, Other Special Revenue Funds account in the Department of Environmental Protection to the General Fund.
