She was a giver. She was somebody who always believed in giving of herself to others, that you leave something special by what you do in other people's lives. In our hectic schedules here it's always nice to take a moment like this and reflect on the unique individuals that we have the pleasure of meeting in life and that we represent in our Districts because they're really the essence of what makes our state such a special place to live. Pat and her husband raised their family to embrace the same values that they believed in and I think those of us who know her son, Tim, recognize that he tries to live and set an example of his life for how he was raised by his parents. The pies are a unique part and sort of a signature for a native Texan. She had, as I understand, always ordered her pecans, because the other manner in which some people referred to that nut has to do with a nighttime can that you might keep in your room as opposed to an actual nut. The pecan came from Texas. She baked hundreds of pies every year to give out to people. In honor of her, I have asked, Mr. President, that a copy of her recipe, which was provided to us at her service, be given to each member and I would encourage you to sort of pay it forward by thinking of her when you might take time to bake a pecan pie or share this recipe with a good friend. Mr. President, I thank you for this opportunity to rise and pay tribute to this special lady and her family and I appreciate the opportunity that my colleagues allowed me.
