Senator **MARTIN**: Mr. President, members of the Senate, there are 3 orders today on your supplements which honor 3 newspeople from the St. John Valley. I'm sure you all know that it is unusual for me to congratulate members of the press during my years of legislative service. But we have an advantage, I think, in the Valley that, frankly, we don't have in the rest of the state. That is, we've had 3 journalists on both sides of the border that have worked in the field for a long time. Longevity, in my opinion, makes a big difference in terms of the quality of the press that is provided for us. Whether it be in the Le Madawaska on the Edmundson side, or in the St. John Valley, or the Bangor Daily News reporter in the Bangor area of Northern Aroostook and now Central. Whether it be Beurmond Banville, Jean Pedneault, or Don Levesque, all three have been in the business for a long

time. As a result of that, I think, the quality of the work speaks for itself and all of them have received honors over the years. So I thought it appropriate that I point that out to you, that we in the valley have something the rest of you don't have. I think it speaks well for continuity and for, basically, the press and for the news stories that we get. If you want some good reports, then you have to move to the St. John Valley, which, of course, I encourage you to do. If not, if you can't do that, may I encourage you to come spend your money. I think that today, speaking of calling this the French Day in the Legislature, it is an appropriate time, I think, to talk about the fact that so many people in Maine, whether they speak French at all, have a heritage that is in-part French. There aren't many people in this state who can escape having had French blood in their veins at one point or another simply because better than 1/3 of Maine people are of French decent and less than that speak French, of course, as was evident this morning by all of you who I think tried gallantly to do the pledge of allegiance, for which I am eternally grateful. But I think it is here and I think it's important that all of us celebrate our heritage. It doesn't matter what the heritage happens to be, because I think our heritage is what makes what we are, whether it be Irish or French or English or Scottish. I know I'll leave someone out, so I'll stop at that. Whatever it may be, I think it makes a difference in who we end up being as citizens in this country and this melting pot of ours. So I think it's been a great day and I think that we really want to say 'hi' to all 3 and at least 2 of them have entered the room and I would ask the President to recognize them being here.
