JOINT RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE DESIGNATION OF THE YORK RIVER AND ITS MAJOR TRIBUTARIES AS A PARTNERSHIP WILD AND SCENIC RIVER IN THE NATIONAL WILD AND SCENIC RIVERS SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the York River, located in southern Maine, with watershed lands in the towns of Eliot, Kittery, South Berwick and York, was evaluated for inclusion in the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System; and

WHEREAS, the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System was established in 1968 to protect rivers with outstanding values for the benefit and enjoyment of present and future generations, and rivers that flow through private lands and are eligible for designation are included in the national system as "partnership" rivers, maintaining all local control of land and river use, subject to existing local and state laws; and

WHEREAS, the York River's water quality, ecological and cultural resources and many outstanding values with national and regional significance make it eligible for Partnership Wild and Scenic River designation; its healthy river habitats and salt marshes support important Gulf of Maine species and improve resilience to climate change impacts; and its vibrant working waterfront contributes to the economy and to community character; and

WHEREAS, the 4 watershed communities strongly support pursuing inclusion of the York River in the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System as a partnership river and accepting the York River Watershed Stewardship Plan, as evidenced by affirmative votes by the people of Eliot and York on November 6, 2018 and adoption of resolutions by town councils in Kittery and South Berwick on November 26, 2018 and December 11, 2018, respectively; and

WHEREAS, with the York River being designated as a partnership river, the 4 York River watershed communities will have access to financial and technical assistance from the National Park Service and will be able to proactively and collaboratively address issues and priorities for the benefit of the watershed region, the State of Maine and the Gulf of Maine environment: now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-ninth Legislature now assembled in the Second Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, take this opportunity to recognize the eligibility and suitability of the York River and its tributaries for designation as a Partnership Wild and Scenic River in the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System and acknowledge the strong community support for designation; and be it further

RESOLVED: That We recognize the benefits and opportunities of Partnership Wild and Scenic River designation to better enable watershed communities to work collaboratively to address important river preservation issues for the long-term benefit of current and future generations of Maine citizens.

JOINT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING THE NATIONAL OCEANIC AND ATMOSPHERIC ADMINISTRATION TO CONSIDER THE SAFETY OF THE MEN AND WOMEN WORKING IN MAINE'S LOBSTER INDUSTRY

WE, your Memorialists, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Maine now assembled in the Second Regular Session, most respectfully present and petition the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration as follows:

WHEREAS, the men and women who work in the Maine lobster industry are constantly at risk of injury and loss of life; and WHEREAS, the safety of these workers must be the primary concern of all government agencies that regulate the ocean; and WHEREAS, the Maine lobster industry has made many changes to help protect the right whale; and

WHEREAS, no right whales have been killed by Maine lobster gear and deaths in 2019 were predominantly by ship strikes in Canadian waters or in one instance due to Canadian fishing gear entanglements; and

WHEREAS, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration has stated that right whales likely are not traveling in the waters in which Maine lobster fishing occurs; and WHEREAS, the proposal to modify the existing Atlantic Large Whale Take Reduction Plan developed by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration will not save any right whales in Maine waters but will put the lives of workers in the Maine lobster industry at great risk; and

WHEREAS, the lobster industry is one of Maine's core traditional natural resource industries and has employed generations of Maine's citizens: and

WHEREAS, the lobster industry contributes \$1.5 billion to Maine's economy and entire communities depend upon the work that the lobster industry provides; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, your Memorialists, respectfully urge and request that the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration take the lives of the men and women of the Maine lobster industry into account in the agency's decision making and understand that the agency's proposed changes to the Atlantic Large Whale Take Reduction Plan will not save one right whale in Maine waters but will put many human lives in danger; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the Honorable Donald J. Trump, President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, to Dr. Neil Jacobs, acting Under Secretary of Commerce for Oceans and Atmosphere, and to each Member of the Maine Congressional Delegation.

THE PRESIDENT PRO TEM: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Knox, Senator Miramant.

Senator MIRAMANT: Thank you, Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, thank you for being part of this Resolution. As we move forward on marine issues, in my role as Chair of the Marine Resources Committee in the State and as a Commissioner on the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission, we work hard to protect the resources of the oceans to protect our lives on this planet and one of the ways we do that is making sure that the different fisheries can thrive and continue to sustain. We're down to 400 white whales, more or less. It changes daily. We have a problem about figuring out how to protect those last 400 from extinction. But one thing we have no evidence of is that within 3 miles of the coast of Maine that we are hurting any of the white whales and we have no evidence of it and we can't get anyone to listen to us. So, NOAA is moving ahead with rules that would affect our fishermen drastically, dramatically, and inappropriately. They're suggesting that we go to different numbers of traps on a trawl and other measures that could become unsafe for our fishing folks out there within these 3 miles and then transitioning to less drastic measures as we move out into open ocean. The point is that when someone comes up with a solution that has no proof that it's part of the problem, they walk away saying, 'We did something great. We solved the problem. Let's move on.' This part of their suggestion that we need to do a lot more within 3 miles is one of those maneuvers. Everybody will feel great and they'll walk away and we won't have identified the real source that's hurting our white whales, which we believe we know and it's not the coast of Maine. So, we're sending this message to say strongly we want you to protect the last white whales. We want them to start to thrive and that there to be a healthy pod of whales everywhere we look. But this isn't going to do it. Sit down, find a real solution to a real problem, and we'll support you 100%, and we've offered them suggestions through the Department of Marine Resources that we believe are good ones. So this is to wake them up and say do it right because we want you to do it before they're all gone. Thank you.
