House Paper 1004, Legislative Document 1383, "An Act To Amend Maine's Municipal Land Use and Eminent Domain Laws Regarding High-impact Electric Transmission Lines," having been returned by the Governor, together with objections to the same, pursuant to Article IV, Part Third, Section 2 of the Constitution of the State of Maine, after reconsideration, the House proceeded to vote on the question: "Shall this Bill become a law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor?"

79 voted in favor and 64 against, and accordingly it was the vote of the House that the Bill not become a law and the veto was sustained.

House Paper 985, Legislative Document 1363, "An Act To Amend Certain Laws Relating to High-impact Electric Transmission Lines," having been returned by the Governor, together with objections to the same, pursuant to Article IV, Part Third, Section 2 of the Constitution of the State of Maine, after reconsideration, the House proceeded to vote on the question: "Shall this Bill become a law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor?"

75 voted in favor and 68 against, and accordingly it was the vote of the House that the Bill not become a law and the veto was sustained.

WHEREAS, the Legislature has learned with deep regret of the death of:
(4-6) the Honorable James E. Davitt, of Hampden. Mr. Davitt served as a captain in the United States Army in Vietnam and received the Bronze Star. He practiced law in Maryland, the District of Columbia and Virginia before moving to Maine in 1990. In 1994, he accepted a faculty position in the Justice Studies program at the University of Maine at Augusta, Bangor Campus and later retired as a tenured professor. He and his wife Mary Louis opened Bangor's first bed and breakfast, Nonesuch Farm B\&B. He was a member of the Board of Visitors of Mountain View Correctional Center, the parish council of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Bangor, the Maine People's Alliance and the Maine Education Association. He served in Maine's House of Representatives during the 127th Legislature, representing Hampden. He also served on the Hampden Planning Board and was a member of the Hampden Historical Society.
