WHEREAS, the Legislature has learned with deep regret of the death of:

(4-4) the Honorable John L. Tuttle, of Sanford, a member of the Maine House of Representatives, who represented House District #98. As a youth, Mr. Tuttle was a standout athlete and a lifeguard. In 1980, he founded the Maine State Lifesaving Association and, from 1984 to 1986, served as a national advisor for the United States Lifesaving Association. He was a 10-year veteran of the Maine Army National Guard and a former emergency medical technician for the Sanford Fire Department and for Northeast Mobile Health Services. He was first elected to the Maine House of Representatives in 1978 and then to the Maine State Senate in 1984. He served in the Legislature for nearly 30 years, including 3 terms in the Senate, and had been serving his 12th term as a representative at the time of his death. He chaired several joint standing committees, including Local and County Government, State Government, Marine Resources, Labor and Veterans and Legal Affairs. In 2009, he was named Legislator of the Year by the Maine Disabilities Council. He was also very active in local government, serving for 10 years on Sanford's Board of Selectman, where he was vice-chair for 5 years, and for 7 years as a Sanford city councilor. He was a member of St. Therese of Lisieux Parish, where he served as a parish lector since 1976. He was a member of the Lions Club and the Elks Club and a 4th Degree member of the Knights of Columbus.
