He dedicated 38 years of his career to the University of Maine at Farmington, where he served as a professor of elementary and secondary social science. He retired as Professor Emeritus in 2013. He published over 100 articles, essays and book reviews in addition to more than 1,000 poems in over 200 journals and three books of poetry, "Universal Essence," "Red Ships," and "Fingers Pointing at the Moon." Dr. Farmer will be long remembered and sadly missed by his wife of 38 years, Margaret, his family and friends and all those whose lives he touched;
