LD 2008 Resolve, to Remove the Prohibition Against Live Plants in State-owned Buildings

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 85 was finally passed without reference to a Committee.

Resolve 2023, chapter 85 requires the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to amend its rules to allow live plants in state-owned buildings unless the plants develop mold or bacteria or are contributing to an insect infestation.

LD 2015 Resolve, Approving the 2023 Draft and Arrangement of the Constitution of Maine Made by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court and Providing for Its Publication and Distribution

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve, 2023, chapter 86 was finally passed without reference to committee.

Pursuant to Article X, Section 6 of the Constitution of Maine, through the passage of Resolve 2023, chapter 86, the Legislature approves the 2023 draft and arrangement of the Constitution of Maine by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court.

Resolve 2023, chapter 86 was finally passed as an emergency measure effective June 27, 2023.

LD 2017 An Act to Fund Collective Bargaining Agreements with Executive Branch Employees

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 406 was enacted without reference to a committee.

Public Law 2023, chapter 406 implements the cost items in the collective bargaining agreements reached between the State and the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, the Maine State Troopers Association, the Maine State Law Enforcement Association, the Maine Service Employees Association, the Fraternal Order of Police and any other certified bargaining representative for an executive branch bargaining unit and provides for equitable treatment for confidential employees and certain other employees excluded from collective bargaining.

The law specifies the costs from the General Fund and Highway Fund to fund salary increases and authorizes the transfer by financial order of available General Fund and Highway Fund balances as necessary.

The law provides for the adjustment of certain salary schedules in fiscal year 2023-24 and in fiscal year 2024-25 consistent with agreements ratified by December 31, 2023. The law also provides for similar

and equitable treatment of confidential employees, probationary employees and other employees excluded from collective bargaining.

The law authorizes the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to be reimbursed up to \$1,200,000 for finalization of the ongoing comprehensive review of the classification and compensation system for executive branch employees and for a market pay study comparing state salaries with those of employees performing comparable work of a sampling of certain private and public employees.

Resolve 2023, chapter 96 was finally passed without reference to committee.

Resolve 2023, chapter 96 authorizes final adoption of portions of Chapter 301: Fee Schedule and Administrative Procedures for Payment of Court or Commission Assigned Counsel, a major substantive rule of the Maine Commission on Indigent Legal Services.

Resolve 2023, chapter 96 was finally passed as an emergency measure effective July 10, 2023.

LD 2019 An Act to Authorize Funding for Collective Bargaining Agreements with Certain Judicial Department Employees

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 407 was enacted without reference to committee.

Public Law 2023, chapter 407 authorizes funding for collective bargaining agreements ratified by December 31, 2023 by the Judicial Department and the 4 bargaining units representing Judicial Department employees.

Public Law 2023, chapter 407 was enacted as an emergency measure effective July 10, 2023.
