TABLE 3 Current Program Year (PY25) Projected Budget.

Rep. Perkins Requested "an audit into the funding sources and expenditures for the LIHEAP program, including expenditures for the LIHEAP grants."

The HEAP program is entirely funded through a single federal grant from the US DHHS. A small amount of supplemental funding comes from the TANF program to augment benefits for TANF-eligible families, but no general state funding has gone into this program since some temporary supplements during the pandemic.

TERMS: Fuel Assistance Benefits is the regular HEAP program; ECIP is emergency fuel deliveries; Assurance 16 is for federally required energy education programming; Program Delivery is for CAA-based staff to certify applications; Admin is for administration by MaineHousing and the CAA's; Weatherization is a portion of MaineHousing's Weatherization Program; CHIP is the Central Heating Improvement Program, for repair and/or replacement of substandard heating systems.

TABLE 4 Breakdown by Partner of LIHEAP Administration and Program Delivery Costs.

Rep. Perkins Requested "a detailed report of administrative costs/expenditures for program administration."

The Federal DHHS, which funds this program, limits administration to 10% of the total grant, but does permit for additional funds to be devoted to pay for program delivery staff. MaineHousing limits those two categories to a total of 25% of the total grant. With the recent increases in program applications received, program delivery has been strained, as available funds have returned to prepandemic levels.
