# Position Overview

The position of an interconnection ombudsman was established under Public Law 2023, Chapter 307, now codified at 35-A M.R.S. sections 107 and 3474(4).

The duties of the interconnection ombudsman include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Tracking interconnection disputes;
- 2. Facilitating the efficient and fair resolution of disputes between customers seeking to interconnect and investor-owned transmission and distribution utilities;
- 3. Reviewing investor-owned transmission and distribution utility interconnection policies to assess opportunities for reducing interconnection disputes;
- 4. Convening stakeholder groups as necessary to facilitate effective communication between interconnection stakeholders;
- 5. Preparing reports that detail the number, type, resolution timeline and outcome of interconnection disputes; and
- 6. Any other technical or regulatory work involving public utilities.

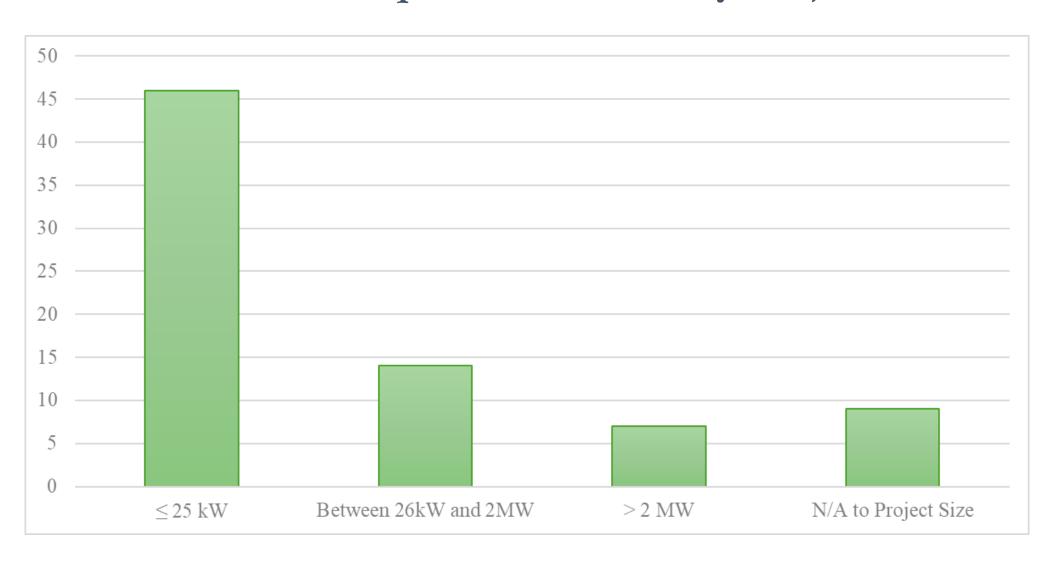

# Example 1:

Inquiry Date: April 4th, 2025

**Project Size:** ≤ 25kW

Summary: Incomplete forms, unpaid fees, communication

issues between installer and utility.

Resolved Date: April 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2025

**Resolution:** Resolved communication issues, forms completed, fees paid, and customer received permission to

operate.

# Example 2:

Inquiry Date: August 4th, 2025

**Project Size:** ≤ 25kW

**Summary:** Failed screens, additional review, next-steps.

Resolved Date: September 26th, 2025

**Resolution:** Project opted to undergo additional review August 12<sup>th</sup> and was later approved on September 26<sup>th</sup>.

## Example 3:

Inquiry Date: August 25th, 2025

Project Size:  $\leq 25 \text{kW}$ 

**Summary:** New home construction; incomplete application; communication issues between solar installer, home builder, and utility.

Resolved Date: August 26th, 2025

**Resolution:** Resolved communication issues, application issue resolved, and completed application submitted.

## Inquiry Examples

### Chapter 324 § 17 - Dispute Resolution

#### § 17(A) - Good Faith Negotiations

- Involves the Interconnection Customer and/or their Installer and the Utility (collectively, "the Parties").
- No requirement for Parties to inform Ombudsman when initiating and undergoing this step of the process.

#### § 17(B) - Informal Dispute Resolution

- Initiated by Ombudsman once:
  - Parties have undergone Good Faith Negotiations, but the dispute remains unresolved;
- o A Party requests Informal Dispute Resolution under Chapter 324 § 17(B); and
- o Parties have provided a written description of dispute and proposed resolution to Ombudsman.
- Involves the Parties, Ombudsman, and MPUC Staff Attorney.
- Five (5) disputes initiated after March 17<sup>th</sup>, 2025, have requested Informal Dispute Resolution.

#### § 17(C) - Maine Public Utilities Commission Resolution

- Initiated by MPUC Staff Attorney once:
  - o Parties have undergone Good Faith Negotiations **and** Informal Dispute Resolution, but the dispute remains unresolved; and
  - A Party has requested MPUC Resolution under Chapter 324 § 17(C).
- Involves the Parties, Staff Attorney(s), Staff Analysts, and a decision gets deliberated and issued by Commissioners.
- **Zero (0)** disputes initiated after March 17<sup>th</sup>, 2025, have requested MPUC Resolution.
