With respect to the Efficiency Maine Trust and the Public Utilities Commission and pursuant to Joint Rule 314, the Joint Standing Committee on Energy, Utilities and Technology (EUT Committee) has voted unanimously to approve the initiatives contained in Part A of the Governor's 2018-19 Biennial Budget (LD 390) that fall within the policy jurisdiction of the EUT Committee with the following exception:

 Public Utilities Commission, page A-561, Ref. # 3113 – The committee voted 9-2 in favor of the initiative that would establish a base allocation in the Cost Recovery Fund Program. Representative O'Connor and Representative Hanley voted against the initiative (Representative Rykerson and Representative DeChant were absent from the vote).

The EUT Committee also unanimously supports the proposed budgets of the Office of the Public Advocate and the Governor's Energy Office, which did not contain any specific initiatives.

The EUT Committee requests, with respect to the ConnectME Authority (Authority) and the Department of Economic and Community Development portions of the budget (pages A-126, A-181 and Part W), more time to evaluate whether this transfer will benefit the development of broadband in the State. The EUT Committee is aware that an alternate proposal regarding the structure of the ConnectME Authority will be introduced this session. We feel that we need to have an opportunity to discuss this alternate proposal before deciding on the proposal in the budget. In addition, we feel we need to further explore the proposed transfer in Part W to fully

understand how this newly created Office of Broadband (Office) is envisioned to function, how the relationship between the Office and Authority will work, what the relationship will be between staff for the Office and the Authority, and the qualifications of staff proposed to be hired for the Office. In addition to the need for more time to weigh organizational alternatives, concerns were raised that the budgeted funds are inadequate for the program, in that the budget significantly reduces funding for staff at a time when demand for technical and other support for providing broadband in remote parts of the State are increasing. Furthermore, we have quite a few bills on broadband this session, including those related to the funding of broadband development. In order to avoid a piecemeal approach to broadband policy, we believe that having an opportunity to work these bills in committee will assist us in having a more defined picture of the best broadband policy for the State, which will better inform our decisions on the best approach to promote that policy.
