We would like to take this opportunity to express the Judiciary Committee's unanimous support for LD 170, *An Act To Allow and Recognize a Legal Name Change upon Marriage*. LD 170 will allow an individual to legally change his or her name upon marriage and to have the new legal name officially identified on the certificate of marriage, by-passing the time and expense of filing a name-change action in the Probate Court. By specifying each party's chosen legal name on the certificate of marriage, LD 170 will streamline the process, providing a legal document that can be used to obtain revised documents from the United States Social Security Administration and Maine Department of Motor Vehicles, as well as when changing the individual's names with banks, creditors, and other entities.

For these reasons, we unanimously support LD 170 and hope that the funding that the Office of Data, Research and Vital Statistics within the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention indicates will be needed to update Maine's new electronic marriage registration system will not stand in the way of its enactment. The method outlined in LD 170 will represent a cost savings to county courts that is likely to outweigh the general fund expenditure.

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### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 19-A MRSA §651, sub-§2, as repealed and replaced by PL 2013, c. 424, Pt. B, §5, is amended to read:

4 2. Application. The parties wishing to record notice of their intentions of marriage shall submit an application for recording notice of their intentions of marriage. The 5 application may be issued to any 2 persons otherwise qualified under this chapter 6 regardless of the sex of each person and must include the names of both parties. If a 7 party intends to change that party's name upon marriage, the application must include the 8 proposed new name of that party. The application must include a signed certification that 9 the information recorded on the application is correct and that the applicant is free to 10 marry according to the laws of this State. The applicant's signature must be 11 acknowledged before an official authorized to take oaths. An application recording 12 notice of intention to marry is not open for public inspection for 50 years from the date of 13 the application except that: 14

- A. The names of the parties for whom intentions to marry are filed and the intended 15 date of marriage are public records and open for public inspection; and 16
- 17 B. A person with a researcher identification card under Title 22, section 2706, subsection 8 is permitted to inspect records and may be issued a noncertified copy of 18 19 an application.
- 20 Sec. 2. 19-A MRSA §654, sub-§3, as amended by PL 2011, c. 111, §1, is further 21 amended to read:

22 3. Statement including officiant and witnesses. The marriage license returned must contain a statement giving the names of the parties united in marriage, place and 23 date of the marriage, the new name of either party if either party intends to change that 24 party's name, the signature of the person by whom the marriage was solemnized and the 25 26 names of the 2 witnesses. The person who solemnized the marriage shall add the title of the office by virtue of which the marriage was solemnized, the residence of the person 27 who solemnized the marriage and: 28

- 29 A. The date ordained or authorized by a religious faith to perform marriages;
  - B. The date the notary public's commission expires;
  - C. The date the lawyer was admitted to the Maine Bar; or
- D. The date the person's temporary registration certificate was issued under section 32 33 655, subsection 1-A.
- 34 Sec. 3. 19-A MRSA §656, sub-§3 is enacted to read:
- 3. Name change. If the marriage license indicates that a party intends to change that 35 party's name under section 654, subsection 3, the new name indicated on the license 36 becomes effective upon completion of the marriage license pursuant to subsection 2. 37

## SUMMARY

This bill allows a person who is getting married to change that person's name by indicating the new name on the application for recording notice of intent to marry, which becomes effective upon the completion of the marriage license.

Pursuant to Joint Rule 314(7), the co-chairs of the Joint Standing Committee on Labor, Commerce, Research and Economic Development have, after consulting the members of our committee, developed the following priorities for final passage of bills reported out of our committee that are now on the Special Appropriations Table:

- 1. LD 848, An Act to Support Law Enforcement Officers and First Responders Diagnosed with Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder. This bill has a municipal mandate and potential, unspecified statewide cost increases. Testimony revealed that many law enforcement officers and first responders do seek and are treated for PTSD already, so there may be no increase or even a decrease in costs if they are encouraged by this legislation to self-identify earlier, making treatment less acute.
- 2. LD 130, An Act to Provide Funding for Costs Associated with Requiring the Licensing of Midwives. It is our understanding that DPFR Commissioner Anne Head has identified existing resources to accomplish the work of setting up a licensure process through the expansion of an existing board.
- 3. LD 503, An Act to Continue the Doctors for Maine's Future Scholarship Program. Any amount of funding would be helpful to the continuation of this important program which, through private-public partnerships, awards 64 medical school scholarships a year to Maine students.
- 4. LD 367, An Act to Implement a Long Range Strategic Plan for Economic Improvement in the State: Important work highly recommended by the Government Oversight Committee.
- 5. LD 970, An Act to End Homelessness by Expanding Housing Support Services. Funds would enable an organization to more efficiently meet the needs of some of our most costly and at-risk chronically homeless individuals.
