# DHHS Program Office Overview

**Office of MaineCare Services:** Oversees MaineCare, the State's Medicaid program.

**Office for Family Independence:** Oversees program eligibility and implementation of safety net programs such as Alternative Aid, Food Supplement, General Assistance (GA), the disbursement of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Maine SNAP-Ed, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Parents as Scholars, and more to build pathways out of poverty for Maine families.

**Office of Child and Family Services:** Oversees child welfare and Child Protective Services (CPS), children's behavioral health and early intervention and prevention programming.

# DHHS Program Office Overview

**Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention:** Oversees Maine’s public health infrastructure, prevention, and emergency management. Additionally, the Division of Licensing and Certification (DLC) manages a variety of health inspection and licensing programs.

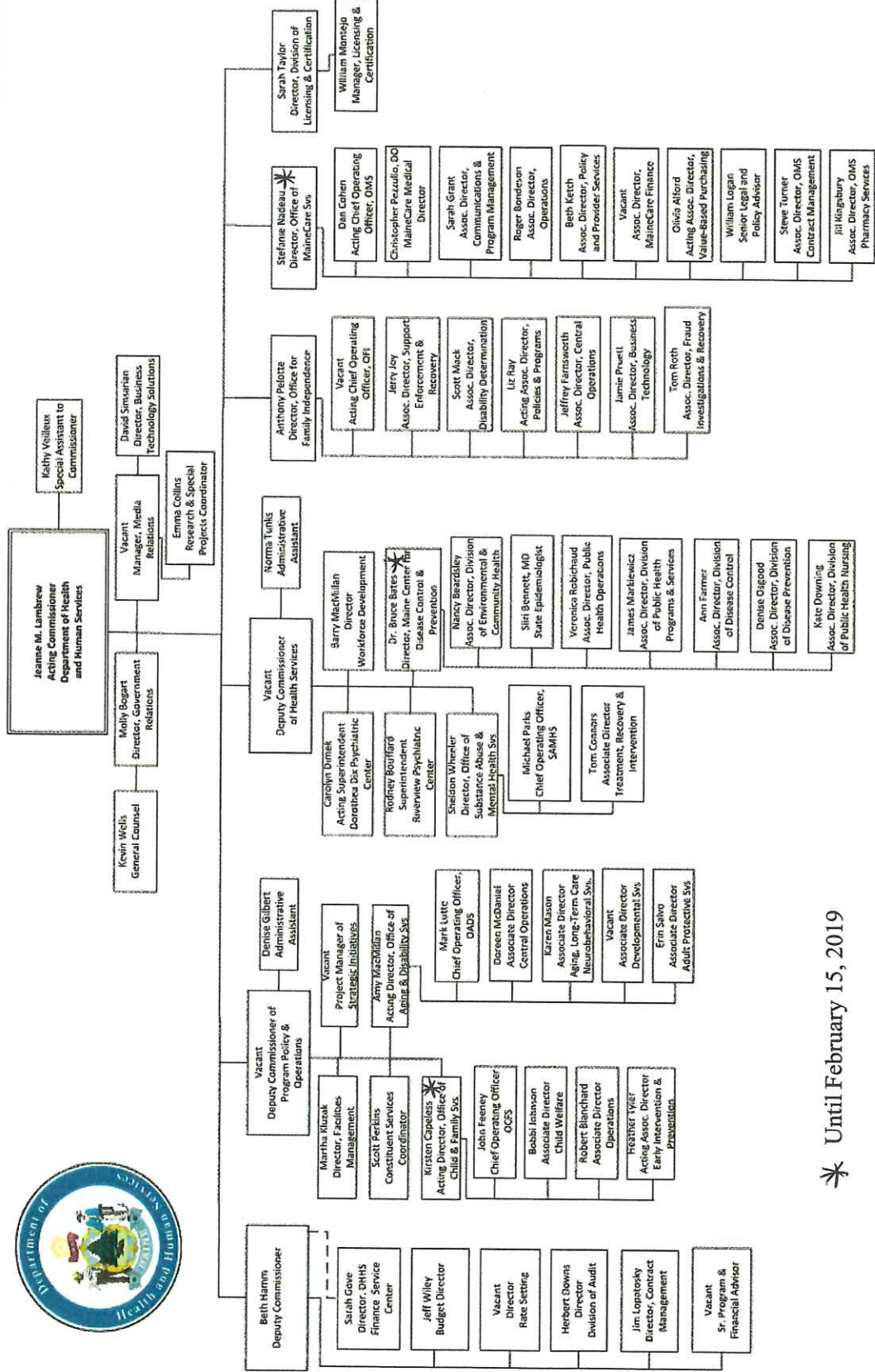
**Office of Aging and Disability Services:** Supports Maine’s older adults and those affected by brain injury, intellectual and developmental disabilities, and other related conditions through Adult Protective Services (APS), long term care, and aging and community services.

**Office of Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services:** Responsible for the planning, development, implementation, regulation, and evaluation of substance use and mental health services.
