Comment: This bill would establish common law marriage in the State. Under the law persons cohabitating and acknowledging each other as spouses, and generally reputed to be spouses, for a period of 3 years and until one of them is deceased, must be deemed to have been legally married.

Title: An Act To Remove Barriers to Entry to the Profession of Dental Therapy and Expand Access for the Underserved Dental Patient Population

Comment: This bill would propose changes to the laws governing dental therapy designed to remove barriers to entry to the profession of dental therapy and to expand access for the underserved dental patient population.
