Statement of Fact

This financial order provides funding to purchase a modular temperature-controlled walk-in cooler which will be used to <u>store COVID-19 vaccine vials</u> at the Public Health Emergency Preparedness State Receiving, Staging, and Storage (RSS) warehouse located at 64 Anthony Avenue in Augusta. The warehouse is not temperature-controlled and currently the refrigerators that are used to store the COVID-19 vaccine vials are inefficient when ambient temperatures are too high. The new modular temperature-controlled unit will offer more flexibility and mobility if the need to move the unit arises. Funding is provided through the Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) Cooperative Agreement and authorized under the Coronavirus Preparedness and Response Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2020.

This financial order provides funds to cover the costs of establishing a Rapid Response Team of contracted nurses who will help ensure the health and safety of the residents in congregate care settings when there are staffing shortages brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic. This team of nurses will be deployed by the Department of Health and Human Services to congregate care facilities if a congregate care facility is on the verge of closure. These staffing resources may also be deployed to support the COVID-19 vaccination effort at sites across the state. This funding should help alleviate current issues with staffing and provide a short-term solution until all congregate care facility staff can be vaccinated. Funds are provided from the Coronavirus Relief Fund under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act.
