In order to protect the press and public's constitutional right to report and publish information that is lawfully obtained, newsworthy and true, the committee may want to consider:

- Adding a paragraph similar to Michigan that states, "An entity is not liable for damages or subject to criminal penalties under this section for reporting a public record of conviction that has been set-aside by court order or operation of law, if that record was available as a public record on the date of the report." (Recognizing it would be a civil penalty in Maine).
- Adding a provision to allow the press and public to petition to review records for a legitimate public interest after the record is sealed through this process
- Including a statement that it is not a violation of this statute to report or publish information that is already in the public domain
