LD 29 An Act To Conform the Maine Apprenticeship Program to the Federal Equal Employment Opportunity Act of 1972

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 95 amends the information relating to a request for demographic data that an apprenticeship agreement under the Maine Apprenticeship Program must contain. It brings the program into compliance with federal Equal Employment Opportunity Act of 1972 standards. It requires that the statement regarding equal opportunity required in an apprenticeship agreement specify that an apprentice may not be discriminated against because of gender identity. It also specifies that an apprentice may not be discriminated against because of age.

LD 37 An Act To Amend the Laws Concerning the Retired County and Municipal Law Enforcement Officers and Municipal Firefighters Health Insurance Program

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 19 amends language contained in Public Law 2019, chapter 446 governing contributions under the open enrollment provisions of the Retired County and Municipal Law Enforcement Officers and Municipal Firefighters Health Insurance Program by removing the condition that required a person hired on or after October 1, 2019 to enroll no later than five years after hire, conditioned on the enrollment and eligibility requirements of the applicable health plan.

Public Law 2021, chapter 19 also changes the percentage of gross wages for contributions and the time period during which contributions of gross percentages must be made. It removes the requirement of 60 months of contributions by enrollees. It also changes the State's payment of certain premium subsidies from payment to the plan to payment directly to enrollees. The amendments to the open enrollment provisions are retroactive to September 19, 2019, and the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of Human Resources, Office of Employee Health and Benefits is required to ensure correct contribution amounts for those who enrolled between September 19, 2019 and the effective date of this legislation.

Public Law 2021, chapter 19 was enacted as an emergency measure effective March 17, 2021.

LD 61 An Act To Include Grandparents under Maine's Family Medical Leave Laws

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 189 allows a grandparent to request employee family medical leave in order to care for a grandchild who has a serious health condition.

LD 99 An Act To Require the State To Divest Itself of Assets Invested in the Fossil Fuel Industry

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 231 requires the State to divest itself of assets invested in the fossil fuel industry in accordance with sound investment criteria and consistent with fiduciary obligations. It requires the Maine Public Employees Retirement System to post quarterly on its website information detailing all its holdings in the public market and private equity investments. It also requires the Maine Public Employees Retirement System, beginning January 1, 2022 and annually thereafter, to issue a report reviewing its environmental, social and governance investment policy. The Treasurer of State and the Board of Trustees of the Maine Public Employees Retirement System shall report annually to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over retirement matters by January 1, 2023, 2024 and 2025 regarding the progress of divestment.

LD 137 An Act Regarding Absence from Work for Emergency Response

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 67 makes changes to the laws governing an employee who is a firefighter or emergency medical services person.

Current law requires that, in order to avoid being subject to discharge or discipline for failure to report for work or being absent when responding to an emergency, an employee who is also a firefighter or emergency medical services person must have presented to the employer within 30 days of employment a copy of a fire department or emergency medical services provider policy that specifies the circumstances under which the employee is needed to respond to an emergency and that affirms that the employee will be released as soon as practicable.

Public Law 2021, chapter 67 removes the requirement that the employee present the copy within 30 days of employment and instead requires that the employee present the copy within 30 days of notifying the employer of the employee's status as a firefighter or emergency medical services person.

Public Law 2021, chapter 67 also corrects a technical error in current law.

LD 189 An Act To Permit All Public Employers To Implement Payroll Deductions for Disability and Life Insurance Policies

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 102 authorizes a public employer to deduct payroll deductions designated in writing by a public employee for disability insurance and life insurance offered in

conjunction with the employee's membership in an employee organization recognized by the employer or designated by a collective bargaining agreement.

LD 190 An Act To Amend the Laws Governing Retirement Benefit Reductions for Corrections Officers Currently Included in the 1998 Special Plan

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 401 requires that service retirement benefits for employees of the Department of Corrections included in the 1998 Special Plan as of October 18, 2021 who receive a direct care stipend pursuant to a collective bargaining agreement and who were employed prior to January 1, 2000 be computed on the same basis as benefits for other members under the plan are computed; creditable service is included regardless of when that service was earned.

LD 213 An Act To Require Coverage for Female Firefighters Facing Reproductive System Cancer

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 325 adds gynecologic cancer to the definition of "cancer" so that there is also a rebuttable presumption under Maine Workers' Compensation Act of 1992 for a firefighter who contracts gynecologic cancer. Under the current law, there is a rebuttable presumption that a firefighter who has contracted kidney cancer, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, colon cancer, leukemia, brain cancer, bladder cancer, multiple myeloma, prostate cancer, testicular cancer or breast cancer has contracted the cancer as a result of that firefighter's employment.

LD 248 An Act Regarding the Board of Occupational Safety and Health

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 103 allows the Board of Occupational Safety and Health the authority to adopt emergency rules.

LD 275 An Act To Amend the Retirement Laws Pertaining to Certain Educational Technicians

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 6 provides an exception to mandatory membership in the State Employee and Teacher Retirement Program for employees filling certain educational technician positions who do not introduce new learning plans and supervise small groups of students in communitybased programs and are therefore not required by statute to be certified.

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Public Law 2021, chapter 6 was enacted as an emergency measure effective March 17, 2021.

LD 319 An Act To Promote Socially Responsible Investing by the Maine Public Employees Retirement System by Prohibiting Investment in For-profit Prisons

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 234 prohibits the Treasurer of State and the Board of Trustees of the Maine Public Employees Retirement System from investing assets in any corporation or company that owns or operates prisons for profit. It also requires the Treasurer of State and the Board of Trustees of the Maine Public Employees Retirement System to divest any such holdings consistent with sound investment criteria and fiduciary obligations.

Public Law 2021, chapter 234 also directs the Board of Trustees of the Maine Public Employees Retirement System to review its environmental, social and governance policy and make necessary changes to conform to the prohibition and to report to the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing by January 1, 2022.

LD 341 Resolve, Directing the Maine Public Employees Retirement System To Study and Report on How Statewide Retirement Systems Affected by the Windfall Elimination Provision and Government Pension Offset Can Cooperate on Solutions

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2021, chapter 84 directs the Maine Public Employees Retirement System to study existing and potential further cooperation with other statewide retirement systems affected by the windfall elimination provision and the government pension offset instead of an interstate compact. The resolve requires the Maine Public Employees Retirement System to submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing no later than January 1, 2022 and authorizes the committee to report out a bill based on the report.

LD 467 An Act To Support E-9-1-1 Dispatchers and Corrections Officers Diagnosed with Post-traumatic Stress Disorder

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 419 adds corrections officers and E-9-1-1 dispatchers to the list of employees for whom there is a rebuttable presumption under the laws governing workers' compensation that when the employee is diagnosed by a licensed psychiatrist or psychologist as having post-traumatic stress disorder resulting from work stress that was extraordinary and unusual, the post-traumatic stress disorder is presumed to have arisen out of and in the course of the worker's employment.

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LD 469 An Act To Ensure Safety across Maine's Construction Industry

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 465 requires a contractor or subcontractor with a public works contract with the State of \$50,000 or more to certify all craft workers who will be on the construction site have taken a safety training program that uses a curriculum approved by the United States Department of Labor, Occupational Safety and Health Administration and that is at least 10 hours in duration.

It also requires a contractor or subcontractor to complete and submit monthly to the public authority that let the contract a signed statement of compliance that each craft worker has completed 10 hours of a safety program. The contractor or subcontractor is required to display at the job site an affidavit showing compliance. It also specifies that a contractor or subcontractor who willfully and knowingly violates the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, section 1317 is subject to a forfeiture of not less than \$250.

It allows the Department of Labor to adopt rules to implement this law.

LD 494 An Act To Change the Compensation Structure of the Maine Labor Relations Board and the State Board of Arbitration and Conciliation

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 421 adjusts the compensation structure for members of the State Board of Arbitration and Conciliation and the Maine Labor Relations Board. For the State Board of Arbitration and Conciliation, the law changes the per diem compensation for members of the board to provide that, when meeting to deliberate or vote with respect to a matter before the board, members receive \$150 a day per meeting for their services for the time actually employed in the discharge of their official duties and, for all other purposes, members receive \$300 a day for their services for the time actually employed in the discharge of their official duties. For the Maine Labor Relations Board, the law provides the board's executive director the discretion to provide the members' per diem compensation and related costs from the board's General Fund appropriation, rather than requiring the parties to a case to share the costs.

LD 509 An Act To Protect Teachers from a Decrease in Retirement Benefits Arising from the COVID-19 Pandemic

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 225 allows a teacher nearing retirement who experiences a reduction in income from the elimination of an extracurricular or cocurricular position due to circumstances

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related to COVID-19, to purchase service credit in the state retirement system for the income lost from the extracurricular or cocurricular position. The opportunity to purchase service credit is limited to teachers who are in their last three years of service and who previously earned income from an extracurricular or cocurricular position that is eliminated or otherwise unavailable during the period from January 1, 2020 to July 1, 2021. The law also clarifies that the lost income is included in the teacher's calculation of average final compensation.

Public Law 2021, chapter 225 was enacted as an emergency measure effective June 16, 2021.

LD 594 Resolve, Directing the Department of Labor To Submit to the United States Secretary of Labor a Plan for a Self-employment Assistance Program

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2021, chapter 20 directs the Department of Labor to submit to the United States Secretary of Labor and the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing a plan to reinstate the self-employment assistance program pursuant to Public Law 1993, chapter 710 and the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, section 1197. The Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing is authorized to submit a bill regarding the program to the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature.

LD 609 Resolve, To Establish a Commission To Increase Housing Opportunities in Maine by Studying Zoning and Land Use Restrictions

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2021, chapter 59 establishes the Commission To Increase Housing Opportunities in Maine by Studying Zoning and Land Use Restrictions, which is a 15-member commission directed to review data on housing shortages in the State for low-income and middle-income households, state laws that affect the local regulation of housing and efforts in other states and municipalities to address housing shortages; to consider measures that would encourage increased housing options in the State; and to review and consider the historical role of race and racism in zoning policies and the best measures to ensure that state and municipal zoning laws do not serve as barriers to racial equality. The commission must, no later than November 3, 2021, submit a report, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing.

Resolve 2021, chapter 59 was finally passed as an emergency measure effective June 15, 2021.

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LD 610 An Act To Amend the Laws Governing Employer Recovery of Overcompensation Paid to an Employee

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 425 amends the definition of "overcompensation" by an employer to exclude compensation in the form of paid leave. It provides a definition of "employer." It changes the maximum amount an employer may withhold from an employee's pay to recover overcompensation from 10% to 5%. It prohibits an employer from recovering more than the amount of overcompensation paid to an employee in the three years preceding the discovery of the overcompensation. It also specifies that the section of law regarding overcompensation by employers that includes these provisions does not limit or affect an employee's general civil remedies against an employer.

LD 620 Resolve, To Develop a Plan for Teachers To Collect Social Security

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2021, chapter 72 directs the Maine Public Employees Retirement System to examine options and make recommendations for a plan to allow teachers in the State to contribute, accumulate credit and collect benefits under the United States Social Security Act in addition to collecting benefits under the Maine Public Employees Retirement System. It requires the Maine Public Employees Retirement System. It requires the Maine Public Employees Retirement System to submit a report on its findings and recommendations, together with any proposed implementing legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing by December 1, 2021 and authorizes the committee to submit a bill to the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature after reviewing the report.

LD 648 An Act To Improve the Lives of Maine Workers by Supporting Apprenticeships That Lead to Good-paying Jobs

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 147 specifies that at least 75% of program funding for apprenticeship programs must be used for reimbursement of direct training costs for apprenticeship programs in which the apprentice starting wage is at least 1.25 times the rate of the minimum wage and the ending wage, upon completion of the apprenticeship agreement, is at least 1.5 times the rate of the minimum wage.

LD 711 An Act To Allow Certain Employees To Return to Participation in the Maine Public Employees Retirement System

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Current law provides that a member of the Participating Local District Retirement Program on the date on which an employer offers an alternative retirement program may make a one-time irrevocable election to remain under that program or to join the alternative retirement plan offered by the employer. Public Law 2021, chapter 90 provides that such an election is not irrevocable and that an employee of a participating local district may elect to rejoin the Participating Local District Retirement Program if the employee is covered by a plan provided by the employer with an employee contribution rate that is not lower than the employee contribution rate for the applicable plan under the Participating Local District Retirement Program and the employee's membership otherwise complies with the United States Internal Revenue Code as applicable to governmental qualified defined benefit plans.

Public Law 2021, chapter 90 was enacted as an emergency measure effective June 8, 2021.

LD 824 An Act To Extend the Protections Provided to State Employees upon the Expiration of Labor Contracts to Other Public Sector Employees

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 282 provides the same protections to municipal, judicial and public higher education employees that are provided to state employees upon the expiration of labor contracts by requiring that, during an interim between the expiration of a public employee collective bargaining agreement and before the effective date of any subsequent collective bargaining agreement, those employees covered by the expired collective bargaining agreement remain eligible for and must receive merit or step increases in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in the expired collective bargaining agreement.

LD 993 An Act To Retroactively Grant Sick Leave Days to Public School Employees Affected by COVID-19

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 378 grants public school employees up to 15 days of sick leave if the employee used sick leave for reasons related to COVID-19. The legislation applies to any sick leave used by an employee from January 1, 2021 until the employee has been granted a maximum of 15 days of sick time for the purposes described in this act.

LD 1101 An Act To Expand the 1998 Special Retirement Plan To Include Civilian Employees Who Work for the Department of Public Safety Crime Lab and Computer Crimes Unit

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 474 allows civilian employees in the employment of the Department of Public Safety, Maine State Police Crime Laboratory or computer crimes unit on October 1, 2021, whose job responsibilities include the handling, examination or analysis of digital or physical evidence, to elect to participate in the 1998 Special Plan of the Maine Public Employees Retirement System. Under that plan, a person may retire at 55 years of age with 10 years of creditable service or may retire before 55 years of age with 25 years of creditable service and at a reduced benefit.

LD 1103 An Act To Allow a 5-year Open Enrollment in the Participating Local District Retirement Program for Certain Law Enforcement Officers, Firefighters and Other Municipal Employees

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 286 allows employees in a participating local district to enroll in the Participating Local District Retirement Program up to and including that employee's 5th-year employment anniversary through an annual open enrollment. It also provides a one-time election for participating local district employees whose five-year work anniversary has passed to join the Participating Local District Retirement Program. The law also clarifies that member contributions for an employee that joins the Participating Local District Retirement Program under the law's provisions may not be made with pretax dollars.

LD 1105 Resolve, Directing the Maine Public Employees Retirement System To Convene a Working Group To Investigate Public Pension Options

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2021, chapter 66 directs the Maine Public Employees Retirement System to convene a working group of representatives of public employers, including the State and school administrative units, and public employees, including the Maine Service Employees Association and the Maine Education Association, to work together to develop new designs for public employee pensions that are based on social security and have comparable benefits to the current defined benefit plan. The working group must submit to the Legislature no later than December 1, 2021, a report containing options for public pensions developed by the working group and proposed plans and timelines for implementation.

LD 1106 An Act To Prohibit an Employer from Charging an Employee for Direct Deposit for Wages

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 158 prohibits an employer from charging a fee for the payment of wages to an employee by means of direct deposit of funds.

LD 1167 An Act Relating to Fair Chance in Employment

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 404 prohibits an employer from requesting criminal history record information on an initial employee application form or stating on an initial employee application form or advertisement or specifying prior to determining a person is otherwise qualified for the position that a person with a criminal history may not apply or will not be considered for a position.

Public Law 2021, chapter 404 provides exceptions to those prohibitions, including instances in which federal or state law or regulation or rule mandates for a position that a criminal conviction disqualifies an applicant, or imposes an obligation on an employer not to hire an applicant who has been convicted of a certain type of offense.

Public Law 2021, chapter 404 provides that if an employer inquires about a prospective employee's criminal history record information during an interview or once the employee has been determined otherwise qualified, the employer must afford the prospective employee an opportunity to explain the information and the circumstances regarding any conviction, including post-conviction rehabilitation.

An employer who violates this prohibition is subject to a penalty of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500 for each violation, to be enforced by the Department of Labor.

LD 1201 Resolve, Directing the Maine State Housing Authority To Engage Stakeholders in an Examination of Fair Chance Housing Policy Options

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2021, chapter 75 directs the Maine State Housing Authority in collaboration with stakeholders to examine fair chance housing policies considered or adopted in other jurisdictions to evaluate options for the State to adopt that would address housing issues and expand housing opportunities for formerly incarcerated individuals without placing an excessive burden on housing providers. It requires the authority to submit a report by February 15, 2022 to the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing that includes findings and recommendations and includes a summary of any meetings that occur regarding the examination, a list of participants in the examination, suggestions to increase the awareness among housing providers of the challenges

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faced by formerly incarcerated individuals in finding housing and any other relevant information. It allows the authority to include suggested legislation in its report. Lastly, it allows the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing to report out legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature based on the report.

LD 1269 An Act To Preserve Fair Housing in Maine

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 270 requires the Maine State Housing Authority, to the extent consistent with federal law, use its funding or any state or local funding in a manner to affirmatively further fair housing in the State. It requires the Maine State Housing Authority in its report to the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing to include data reported by municipal housing authorities to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development on affirmatively furthering fair housing. The report must also contain a recommendation from the Maine State Housing Authority on a method by which municipal authorities may annually submit data and reports to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over housing matters.

LD 1397 Resolve, Directing the Maine State Housing Authority To Assist the City of Lewiston with its Rental Registration Program

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2021, chapter 88 requires the Maine State Housing Authority to assist the City of Lewiston in its rental registration program as a pilot project to serve as a model for developing a similar program for all housing authorities in the State. The Maine State Housing Authority must submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing by January 15, 2022. The joint standing committee may report out a bill to the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature.

LD 1489 An Act To Update the Classification of Service Employees

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 288 gradually increases the amount of tips an employee must receive to be considered a service employee from \$30 per month to \$175 per month beginning January 1, 2023 and provides that this amount, beginning on January 1, 2024, must be increased by the same percentage of the increase, if any, in the cost of living.

LD 1530 An Act To Allow People To Live in Tiny Homes as a Primary or Accessory Dwelling

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 219 requires municipalities to permit tiny homes to be placed or erected on individual lots where single-family dwellings are allowed or as an accessory structure, subject to all applicable land use requirements as single-family dwellings or as an accessory structure.

LD 1546 An Act Directing the Maine State Housing Authority To Report on Emergency Rental Assistance Programs

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 322 requires the Maine State Housing Authority to provide to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over housing matters copies of any reports required to be submitted to the United States Department of the Treasury or the Governor regarding the administration of the emergency rental assistance programs recently enacted by Congress.

If no such reports are required, the Maine State Housing Authority is required to annually report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over housing matters regarding rental assistance distributed by the authority.

LD 1559 Resolve, To Create the Commission To Develop a Paid Family and Medical Leave Benefits Program

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2021, chapter 122 establishes the Commission To Develop a Paid Family and Medical Leave Benefits Program.

It requires the State Controller to transfer \$200,000 from the available balance in the Adult Use Marijuana Regulatory Coordination Fund Other Special Revenue Services Funds account within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to the Legislature, Study Commissions – Funding Other Special Revenue Funds account.

LD 1564 An Act To Amend the Laws Governing Unemployment Compensation

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 456 makes the following changes to the laws governing unemployment compensation.

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- 1. It increases the amount of wages a person may receive and still be considered partially unemployed. It also specifies that the amount of wages a person may receive and still be considered partially unemployed is indexed to the increase in the cost of living, if any, beginning the first Sunday of June 2022 and annually thereafter.
- 2. It provides the Commissioner of Labor or the commissioner's designee discretion to deduct the amount of unemployment benefits erroneously paid to a person from any future benefits payable to that person. Current law vests this discretion in the Unemployment Insurance Commission. It also provides that unemployment benefits erroneously paid may not be recovered from a person who, in the judgment of the commissioner or the commissioner's designee, is without fault and when, in the judgment of the commissioner or the commissioner's designee, such recovery would defeat the purpose of benefits or would be against equity and good conscience. Current law vests this judgment in the commission.
- 3. It specifies that a benefit overpayment accrues interest at the rate of 1.0% per month or per fraction of a month from the first of the month following the date the determination establishing the benefit overpayment becomes final until payment plus accrued interest is received by the Department of Labor, Bureau of Unemployment Compensation.
- 4. It transfers rule-making authority pertaining to unemployment insurance from the Unemployment Insurance Commission to the Commissioner of Labor.
- 5. It requires the bureau, whenever a legislative proposal containing an unemployment compensation benefit change is proposed, to consider the estimated effect of the proposed change on the State's unemployment insurance recipiency rate.
- 6. It provides that an individual's earnings disregard in effect on the first Sunday of June 2022 and each first Sunday of June thereafter must increase by the increase, if any, in the cost of living.
- 7. It increases the allowance for dependents and the cap on the allowance for dependents. It also specifies that only one individual is entitled to a dependency allowance for the same dependent with respect to any week.
- 8. It provides eligibility for unemployment compensation for a person who leaves employment due to the unexpected loss of child or elder care under certain circumstances.
- 9. It provides that evidence presented at a fact-finding interview by interested parties who personally participate in the interview by telephone or email or other electronic means is permitted for a determination of eligibility for unemployment compensation.
- 10. It specifies additional conditions that trigger an extended benefit period.

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- 11. It increases the total extended benefit amount in a high unemployment period.
- 12. It establishes a peer workforce navigator pilot program.
- 13. It requires the Commissioner of Labor to convene an unemployment insurance working group to examine the unemployment insurance program pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, chapter 13. The commissioner must submit a report of the working group's recommendations and any suggested legislation to the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing no later than January 15, 2022. The Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing may submit a bill in response to this report to the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature.
- 14. It requires the Department of Labor, Bureau of Unemployment Compensation to complete an analysis of the State's unemployment insurance recipiency rate and to report to the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing no later than February 1, 2022. The Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing may submit a bill in response to this report to the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature.

LD 1613 Resolve, Directing the Department of Economic and Community Development, the Department of Labor and the Department of Transportation To Develop Partnerships with Businesses, Unions and Educational Programs and Institutions To Provide Training and Transportation for Workers

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2021, chapter 92 directs the Department of Economic and Community Development, the Department of Labor and the Department of Transportation to collaborate to develop partnerships with businesses, unions and educational programs and institutions to provide a hub for workers to get transportation to training programs, apprenticeships and jobs and receive information about open positions and training opportunities.

LD 1644 An Act To Improve the Disability Retirement Program of the Maine Public Employees Retirement System

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2021, chapter 277 amends the laws relating to disability retirement under the Maine Public Employees Retirement System and makes other changes relating to the structure of the Maine Public Employees Retirement System.

The law does the following.

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- 1. It repeals the laws providing for a medical board and permits the executive director to contract with a medical review service provider.
- 2. It provides that the system's hearing officers are not employees of the Board of Trustees of the Maine Public Employees Retirement System but independent contractors that serve as neutral and independent decision makers.
- 3. It modifies the definition of "disabled".
- 4. It provides that an adverse decision by a hearing officer that is appealed to the court must be given de novo review.
- 5. It restructures the disability retirement application process so that the executive director may grant benefits based on medical records and the member's health care provider's views, may obtain opinions and recommendations from the medical review service provider and may not deny an application for disability retirement benefits without first obtaining an independent medical examination unless waived by the member.
- 6. It provides that, when reviewing medical evidence before making a determination of disability, the board, executive director and hearing officers must primarily consider medical opinions in the record and whether the opinions are supported by sound medical evidence and are consistent with other medical evidence in the record.
- 7. It provides that attorney's fees up to a maximum of \$12,000 must be paid by the Maine Public Employees Retirement System for a member who appeals the denial of disability benefits and who subsequently is awarded those benefits.
- 8. It requires the retirement system to report no later than January 31, 2023 to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over retirement matters on the experience of the retirement system and its members under the changes made by the law. The joint standing committee may report out a bill to the 131st Legislature on matters related to the report.
- 9. It requires formation of a stakeholder group to report no later than January 3, 2023 to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over retirement matters on implementing mandatory long-term disability insurance coverage. The joint standing committee may report out a bill to the 131st Legislature on matters related to the report.
