The Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry (ACF) Committee is pleased to submit the following report for the proposed 2022-2023 supplemental budget initiatives related to Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry. The ACF Committee voted unanimously in favor of all initiatives and language parts with the exception of seven initiatives where there was one vote against the initiative (Rep. Underwood): Ref. #206 on Page 17, Ref. #108 and 109 on Page 32, Ref. #119 and 120 on Page 35 and Ref. #128 and 129 on Page 36.

In addition, the justification language for Ref. #73 and 74 on Page 4 is incorrect; the ACF Committee voted unanimously to strike this language to correct the technical error in the reportback document and to insert the following language:

This initiative aligns work effort with appropriate funding and eliminates allocation in the Federal Expenditures Fund account.

The ACF Committee also unanimously voted to add the phrase "in a non-lapsing fund" at the end of the initiative language associated with Ref. #1015 on Page 48. The intent is to make clear that the ongoing funding for additional operational costs associated with arthropod management research, education and outreach within the University of Maine Cooperative Extension Diagnostic and Research Laboratory should be in a non-lapsing fund.

In addition, the ACF Committee recommends the following proposed changes to the supplemental budget.

1. Polyfluoroalkyl and Perfluoroalkyl Substances or PFAS

The ACF Committee voted unanimously (12-0) in favor of establishing two positions, one Public Service Manager III position and one Public Service Coordinator I position, within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry in the Office the Commissioner program to address PFAS contamination on agricultural land in the State. The ACF Committee recommends adding these positions to the baseline budget (adding two legislative count positions).

In addition, as part of this unanimous vote the committee strongly supports the following transfer from the General Fund (GF):

Office of the Commissioner 0401

Initiative: Establishes one Public Service Manager III and one Public Service Coordinator I and provides funding for initiatives to administer the funding and to address perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances, or PFAS, contamination on agricultural land in the State.

In addition, we understand the following new language will need to be added to the supplemental budget to move forward with the recommendation above.

Transfer to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Office of the

Commissioner program. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on or before May 1, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer \$100,000,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Office of the Commissioner program, Fund To Address PFAS Contamination, Other Special Funds account for the purposes as provided under Title 7, section 320-K, subsection 4.

2. Fund to Address Food Insecurity and Provide Nutrition Incentives

A majority of the ACF Committee (12-1 with Underwood against) voted in favor of adding \$50,000 GF funding to allow for GF matching dollars in the Fund to Address Food Insecurity and Provide Nutrition Incentives program as authorized by Public Law 2021, chapter 468.

Justification: This will provide on-going funding to allow the department to support the program with matching funds.

3. Assistance to municipalities with solar siting and planning

A majority of the ACF Committee (8-1 with Underwood against) voted in favor of adding one ongoing Public Service Coordinator I position in the Bureau of Agriculture program and related All Other costs in the Office of the Commissioner to assist municipalities with solar siting and planning.

4. Bureau of Parks and Lands Capital Equipment Needs

The ACF Committee voted unanimously (13-0) to provide GF funds to the Bureau of Parks and Lands to purchase the following capital equipment (listed in order of priority):

- 10 tractors/lawn mowers (unit cost \$10,000 each) estimated cost total of \$100,000;
- 5 snowmobiles (unit cost \$11,500 each) estimated cost total of \$57,500; and
- 8 ATVs/UTVs (unit cost \$12,000 each) estimated cost total of \$96,000.

Initiative: Provides funding to purchase 10 lawn tractors, 5 snowmobiles and 8 ATV/UTV's.

5. Incentivizing Soil Carbon Sequestration

A majority of the ACF Committee (11-1 with Underwood against) voted in favor of providing one-time funding, \$90,000 GF in fiscal year 22-23, in the Maine Healthy soils program and provided to the University of Maine to investigate incentivizing land management that increases soil carbon sequestration. The purpose of the funding is to review lands of the State, including wetlands, lands in grass and forests to model potential carbon storage with the goal of improved land management.

Additional Language needed:

Transfer to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Maine Healthy Soils Program. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on or before July 1, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer \$90,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Maine Healthy Soils Program, Maine Healthy Soils Fund, Other Special Funds account for the purpose of providing funds to the University of Maine to investigate incentivizing land management that increases soil carbon sequestration.

Finally, the ACF Committee wanted to take this opportunity to reiterate our support of LD 1805, Resolve, Regarding Legislative Review of Chapter 26: Producer Margins, a Major Substantive Rule of the Maine Milk Commission and the corresponding proposed rule change, which increases the short-run break-even target prices to dairy farmers in all four tiers of production.

As we have recently successfully filled several vacancies, we've needed to request vehicles that we had turned in previously to avoid unnecessary costs during a time that we were experiencing low Ranger recruitment. Our lean, 4-person maintenance crew maintains over 300 buildings, 150+ miles of gravel road, a fleet of more than 45 trucks and snowmobiles, off-grid power systems and an extensive radio communication system. The difficulty of this maintenance load is compounded by a busy visitor season which runs concurrent to the maintenance season. §1802. Bureau of Parks and Lands established

There is established within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry the Bureau of Parks and Lands, which shall carry out the responsibilities of State Government relating to parks, historic sites, submerged and intertidal lands, public reserved lands and nonreserved public lands.

1. Director. The executive head of the bureau is the director.

A. The powers and duties of the position of director may not be combined with any other position within the bureau or department.

B. The position of director may not be filled in an acting capacity; the appointee must be a permanent full-time employee.

2. Deputy director. The director is assisted in executive duties by a deputy director. The deputy director position is a classified, confidential position.

3. Personal attendance to duties. The director and the deputy director shall attend personally to the duties of their offices as far as practicable.

4. Appointment. The director and the deputy director are <u>is</u> appointed by and will serve at the pleasure of the commissioner.

Sec. O-1. Transfer from General Fund unappropriated surplus; Community-based Greenhouses. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on or before June 30, 2022, the State Controller shall transfer \$1,500,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Community-based Greenhouse-Bureau of Agriculture, Other Special Revenue Funds account for grants for durable (glass, polycarbonate, etc.) greenhouse structures and associated siting and installation costs to schools, community centers, and other eligible public entities as determined by the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry.

PART O SUMMARY
