SUBJ:	Funding priority recommendations for ENR bills on Appropriations Table

Pursuant to Joint Rule 314(7), we are reporting our committee's priorities for final passage of bills reported out of our committee that are now on the Appropriations Table.

As noted in the attached memo sent by our committee analyst to our committee, ENR members were invited to rank both bills currently on the table and those bills that could end up on the table.

Attached are forms signed by the 7 committee members who returned recommendations indicating their funding preferences.

Re: ENR Bills on the Appropriations Table

The AFA Committee has requested a list of each policy committee's priorities for bills on the Appropriations Table <u>no later than 5:00 pm on Monday, April 4th</u>. At this time, not all bills voted this session by ENR have received a completed fiscal analysis and not all bills with a completed fiscal analysis have yet reached the point in the floor process where placement on the Table might occur. That being said, based on the general requirements for placement of a bill on the Table and the fiscal information that we do have, there are 8 total bills, described below, that are on the Table or could end up on the Table.

Bills currently on the Table

- 1. LD 203, An Act To Increase Funding for the St. Croix International Waterway Commission (Senator Moore, sponsor)
 - Reported out of ENR in 2021, voted unanimous OTP-AM.
 - Carried over on the Table.
 - Requires \$25,000 in General Fund (GF) appropriations for the St. Croix International Waterway Commission beginning in FY 22.
 - LD 221 (the biennial budget bill) as enacted in 2021 included in Section A-35 this same annual, ongoing \$25,000 appropriation to the St. Croix Commission.
- 2. LD 1467, An Act To Promote a Circular Economy through Increased Post-consumer Recycled Plastic Content in Plastic Beverage Containers (Representative Doudera, sponsor)
 - Reported out of ENR in 2021, voted unanimous OTP-AM.
 - Carried over on the Table.
 - Requires a future biennium GF cost increase to DEP of \$89,795 in FY 24 and \$93,865 in FY 25.
- 3. LD 1488, Resolve, To Study and Recommend Improvements to Maine's Dam Safety (Representative Bell, sponsor)
 - Reported out of ENR in 2021, voted majority OTP-AM, minority ONTP (Representatives Hanley, O'Connor and Tuell).
 - Carried over on the Table.
 - Requires a one-time GF appropriation of \$20,000 to MEMA in FY 22.
- 4. LD 1875, Resolve, To Address Perfluoroalkyl and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances Pollution at State-owned Solid Waste Landfills (Representative Zeigler, sponsor)

- Reported out of ENR in 2022, voted unanimous OTP-AM.
- Fiscal note indicates a current biennium GF cost increase but notes that the DAFS/BGS study, expected to cost between \$50,000 and \$75,000, can be paid from an existing GF appropriation and no additional appropriations are required.
- 5. LD 1974, An Act To Establish and Fund the Maine Climate Corps Program Pursuant to Recommendations in the Report Required by Resolve 2021, Chapter 25 (ENR Committee bill)
 - Reported out of ENR in 2022, voted unanimous OTP-AM.
 - Requires total GF appropriations of \$1,256,550 to DOE/Maine Commission for Community Service in FY 23, \$406,550 of which will be ongoing (\$600,00 in one-time funding).

Bills with fiscal information that could end up on the Table

- 1. LD 1979, An Act To Sustain Good-paying Jobs in the Forest Products Industry by Ensuring Consistency between Comprehensive River Resource Management Plans and State Water Quality Standards (President Jackson, sponsor)
 - Not yet reported out of ENR. Voted majority OTP-AM/minority OTP-AM (Representatives Hanley, O'Connor and Tuell).
 - Majority report not anticipated to end up on Table.
 - Minority report requires total GF appropriations of \$507,511 to DACF beginning in FY 23, projected to drop to \$335,036 beginning in FY 25.

Bills awaiting fiscal information that could end up on the Table

- 1. LD 1911, An Act To Prohibit the Contamination of Clean Soils with So-called Forever Chemicals (Representative Pluecker, sponsor)
 - Not yet reported out of ENR, still awaiting fiscal information. Voted majority OTP-AM, minority OTP-AM (Representatives Hanley, O'Connor), minority ONTP (Representative Tuell).
 - Unclear at this time whether either amendment will require a fiscal note that would meet the requirements for placement on the Table.
- 2. LD 2018, An Act To Implement Recommendations Regarding the Incorporation of Equity Considerations in Regulatory Decision Making (ENR Committee bill)
 - Not yet reported out of ENR, still awaiting fiscal information. Voted majority OTP, minority OTP-AM (Representatives Hanley, O'Connor, Tuell).
 - Unclear at this time whether the OTP or minority amendment will require a fiscal note that would meet the requirements for placement on the Table.
