RE: Committee Priorities – Special Appropriations Table

During the 130th Legislature, the Marine Resources Committee reported out 2 bills that if enacted by the Legislature will be placed on the Special Appropriations Table. Those bills are:

- LD 1898, An Act to Address the Economic Impact of Federal Closures of Maine's Fixed Gear Fishing Industry; and
- LD 1916, An Act to Create a Legal Defense Fund for the Maine Lobster Industry

Committee members were polled as to which of these bills was the committee's top priority. Six members identified LD 1898 as the top priority and 5 members voted LD 1916 as the top priority. Two committee members did not register a vote.
