Resolve, To Study the Feasibility of Off-road Bike and Walking Paths along the Busiest Commuting Corridors in the State

- **Sec. 1 Study required. Resolved:** That the Department of Transportation shall conduct a study of the feasibility, benefits and cost of constructing a network of off-road bike and walking paths along the commuting corridors with the highest volume of traffic in the State. This study must:
- 1. Identify and map out the routes on which the greatest number of state residents commute to work each day;
- 2. Identify the routing possibilities and obstacles to constructing off-road bike and walking paths that could be used for alternative means of transportation to work;
- 3. Estimate the number of persons likely to use such paths for commuting, fitness or recreational purposes; and
 - 4. Estimate the cost of constructing such a path network.

The Department of Transportation shall submit a report on the results of this study to the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation on or before January 15, 2008.

SUMMARY

This resolve requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a study on the feasibility, benefits and cost of constructing a network of off-road bike and walking paths along the commuting corridors with the highest volume of traffic in the State.
