An Act To Require a Person To Notify Law Enforcement Officers of the Possession of a Hypodermic Needle

- 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 2 Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §1111-B is enacted to read:

3 <u>§1111-B.</u> Failure to inform law enforcement officer of possession of hypodermic 4 <u>apparatus</u>

5 **1.** A person is guilty of failure to inform a law enforcement officer of a person's 6 possession of a hypodermic apparatus if the person in fact is in possession of a 7 hypodermic apparatus on the person's body and the person in fact fails to inform a law 8 enforcement officer that the person is in possession of a hypodermic apparatus on the 9 person's body during the course of any arrest or detention of the person.

2. A hypodermic apparatus and any contents of such apparatus are inadmissible as
evidence in any prosecution for a violation of this chapter if the hypodermic apparatus
was obtained as a result of the person's informing a law enforcement officer of the
possession of the hypodermic apparatus as required by subsection 1.

Failure to inform a law enforcement officer of a person's possession of a
hypodermic apparatus is a Class D crime.

SUMMARY

This bill establishes the failure to inform a law enforcement officer of a person's possession of a hypodermic apparatus as a Class D crime. Under the bill, if a person discloses the possession of a hypodermic apparatus as required, the hypodermic apparatus and any contents of the apparatus are inadmissible as evidence in a prosecution for a violation of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 17-A, chapter 45.
