1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §4011-A, sub-§7,** as enacted by PL 2013, c. 268, §1, is
3 amended to read:

4 **7. Children under 6 months of age or otherwise nonambulatory.** A person
5 required to make a report under subsection 1 shall report to the department if a child who
6 is under 6 months of age or otherwise nonambulatory exhibits evidence of the following:

7 A. Fracture of a bone;

8 B. Substantial bruising or multiple bruises;

9 C. Subdural hematoma;

10 D. Burns;

11 E. Poisoning; or

12 F. Injury resulting in substantial bleeding, soft tissue swelling or impairment of an
13 organ.

14 This subsection does not require the reporting of injuries occurring as a result of the
15 delivery of a child attended by a licensed medical practitioner.

16 **SUMMARY**

17 The bill creates an exception to the law mandating a report to the Department of
18 Health and Human Services of suspected abuse or neglect of a child under 6 months of
19 age for injuries occurring during birth when the delivery is attended by a licensed medical
20 practitioner.
