## An Act To Simplify Dog Licensure By Establishing a 3-year License

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §3922, sub-§1, as amended by PL 2003, c. 405, §§10 to 12, is further amended to read:
4 5 6	<b>1. License; January 1st.</b> Each Except as provided in subsection 2-A, each owner or keeper of a dog at the age of 6 months or more, on or before January 1st of each year, shall obtain a license:
7	A. From the clerk of the municipality where the dog is kept;
8 9 10	B. From the dog recorder in the unorganized territory where the dog is kept or, in the absence of a duly authorized dog recorder, from a dog recorder in the nearest municipality or unorganized territory in the same county where the dog is kept;
11	C. From a veterinary licensing agent in accordance with section 3923-F; or
12	D. From the department using the Internet in accordance with section 3923-G.
13	Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §3922, sub-§2-A is enacted to read:
14 15 16 17	<b>2-A.</b> Three-year license. An owner or a keeper of a dog 6 months of age or older that has been vaccinated with a 3-year rabies vaccine during the calendar year prior to the year for which licensure is sought may obtain a 3-year license. Under this subsection, the owner or keeper of a dog may obtain a 3-year license:
18	A. From the clerk of the municipality where the dog is kept;
19 20 21	<u>B.</u> From the dog recorder in the unorganized territory where the dog is kept or, in the absence of a duly authorized dog recorder, from a dog recorder in the nearest municipality or unorganized territory in the same county where the dog is kept;
22	C. From a veterinary licensing agent in accordance with section 3923-F; or
23	D. From the department using the Internet in accordance with section 3923-G.
24 25	Sec. 3. 7 MRSA §3923-A, sub-§1, as amended by PL 2007, c. 439, §15, is further amended to read:
26 27 28 29 30	<b>1. Dogs capable of producing young.</b> A dog owner or keeper shall pay a fee of \$11, or \$33 for a 3-year license as provided in section 3922, subsection 2-A, to the municipal clerk for each dog 6 months of age or older and capable of producing young. A dog is considered capable of producing young unless certification under subsection 2 is provided.
31 32	The municipal clerk shall retain a \$1 recording fee and pay the remaining \$10 remainder of the fee to the department for deposit in the Animal Welfare Fund.
33 34	Sec. 4. 7 MRSA §3923-A, sub-§2, as amended by PL 2003, c. 405, §13, is further amended to read:
35 36	<b>2.</b> Dogs incapable of producing young. A dog owner shall pay a fee of \$6 <u>, or \$18</u> for a 3-year license as provided in section 3922, subsection 2-A, to the municipal clerk or

- 1 to a veterinary licensing agent for each dog 6 months of age or older and incapable of 2 producing young. A dog is considered incapable of producing young when the owner 3 provides the following: 4 A. A written certificate issued by a veterinarian stating that the veterinarian has neutered the dog: 5 6 B. A written certificate issued by a veterinarian stating that the veterinarian has examined the dog and determined that the dog is incapable of producing young; or 7 8 C. A previous license stating that the dog is incapable of producing young. 9 The municipal clerk shall retain a \$1 recording fee, deposit \$2 in the municipality's 10 animal welfare account established in accordance with section 3945 and pay the remaining \$3 remainder of the fee to the department for deposit in the Animal Welfare 11 Fund. 12 13 **SUMMARY**
- 14This bill provides an option for an owner or keeper of a dog to obtain a 3-year license15if the dog has received a 3-year rabies vaccine. The bill also establishes a 3-year license16fee of \$33 for dogs capable of producing young and \$18 for dogs incapable of producing17young.
