Resolve, To Require the Maine Turnpike Authority To Study the Feasibility of Constructing a Gorham Connector

1 Sec. 1. Maine Turnpike Authority to study feasibility of constructing connector. Resolved: That the Maine Turnpike Authority shall study the feasibility of 2 3 undertaking the planning, design and construction of a connector in the Town of Gorham in Cumberland County from Route 114 in South Gorham to an interchange on the Maine 4 Turnpike, referred to in this resolve as "the connector." In conducting the study, the 5 authority shall examine the need for the connector, determine whether the authority is the 6 7 best entity, from both efficiency and fiscal viewpoints, to construct the connector and 8 evaluate all reasonable alternatives, as required by the Sensible Transportation Policy 9 Act. If the authority determines that it is the best entity to construct the connector, the authority shall provide options for funding the planning, design and construction of the 10 11 connector.

12 The authority shall report its findings and recommendations, along with any 13 necessary implementing legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation 14 no later than December 6, 2017. The joint standing committee may report out a bill to the 15 Second Regular Session of the 128th Legislature based on the findings and 16 recommendations of the authority.

SUMMARY

18 This resolve requires the Maine Turnpike Authority to examine the feasibility of the 19 authority's planning, designing and constructing a connector from the Town of Gorham to 20 the Maine Turnpike. The authority is required to examine all reasonable alternatives and 21 report its findings and recommendations, including funding methods, to the Joint 22 Standing Committee on Transportation, which may report out a bill to the Second 23 Regular Session of the 128th Legislature based on the report of the authority.
