An Act To Provide More Efficient Notice of Public Activities

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 1 MRSA §603 is enacted to read:

3 §603. Electronic publication of legal notices

4 Notwithstanding any other section of law, beginning July 1, 2013, a state agency may not publish in a newspaper any legal notice, legal advertising or any other matter required 5 by law to be published in a newspaper but instead must post the notice on a publicly 6 7 accessible website maintained by the State. Notices must continue to be posted according to the time frames that exist in law for newspaper publication. For the purposes of this 8 section, "state agency" means any unit of State Government including any state board or 9 commission but not including the Legislature, the Judicial Department, the University of 10 Maine System, the Maine Community College System and the Maine Maritime 11 12 Academy.

13 Sec. 2. Report to recommend exemptions. The Secretary of State and the 14 Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services shall jointly examine current 15 requirements for publication of legal notices in a newspaper and report to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government. The Secretary of State and the 16 17 Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services shall contact all state agencies, 18 including all boards and commissions but not including the Legislature, the Judicial Department, the University of Maine System, the Maine Community College System and 19 the Maine Maritime Academy, to determine all instances of legal notice publication 20 21 requirements existing in the Maine Revised Statutes and request recommendations from 22 those agencies regarding which notices should continue to be published in a newspaper 23 after July 1, 2013. The Secretary of State and the Commissioner of Administrative and 24 Financial Services shall jointly submit a report based on the recommendations from the State agencies, along with any necessary implementing legislation to the Joint Standing 25 26 Committee on State and Local Government by December 15, 2012, and the committee is 27 authorized to report out legislation to enact those recommendations.

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SUMMARY

29 This bill changes the requirement for public notices to be published in a newspaper. 30 Beginning July 1, 2013, a state agency may no longer publish a legal notice, legal 31 advertising or other matter required by law to be published in a newspaper but must instead post such notices on a publicly accessible website maintained by the State. "State 32 agency" is defined as any unit of State Government, including any state board or 33 commission but not including the Legislature, the Judicial Department, the University of 34 Maine System, the Maine Community College System and the Maine Maritime 35 Academy. The Secretary of State and the Commissioner of Administrative and Financial 36 Services shall contact all state agencies to determine all instances of legal notice 37 publication requirements existing in the Maine Revised Statutes and request 38 39 recommendations from those agencies regarding which notices should continue to be published in a newspaper after July 1, 2013. 40 The Secretary of State and the 41 Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services shall jointly submit a report based on the recommendations from the state agencies, along with any necessary 42

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- implementing legislation to the Joint Standing Committee of State and Local Government by December 15, 2012, and the committee is authorized to report out legislation to enact 2
