1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §262 is enacted to read:
3	§262. Prohibited photographing of a minor
4	1. As used in this section, the following terms have the following meanings.
5	A. "Minor" means a person who has not attained 18 years of age.
6	B. "Photograph" has the same meaning as in section 281, subsection 3.
7 8 9	2. A person is guilty of prohibited photographing of a minor if that person is required to register pursuant to Title 34-A, chapter 15 and intentionally photographs a minor without the consent of the minor's parent or guardian.
10	3. Prohibited photographing of a minor is a Class D crime.
