RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine To Lower the Age Requirement To Run for Legislative Office

Presented by Senator BRAKEY of Androscoggin. Cosponsored by Representatives: CHENETTE of Saco, RUSSELL of Portland. 1 **Constitutional amendment. Resolved:** Two thirds of each branch of the 2 Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be 3 proposed:

4 **Constitution, Art. IV, Pt. First, §4, first** ¶ is amended to read:

5 Section 4. Qualifications; residency requirement. No person shall be a 6 member of the House of Representatives, unless the person shall, at the commencement 7 of the period for which the person is elected, have been 5 years a citizen of the United 8 States, have arrived at the age of 24 <u>18</u> years, have been a resident in this State one year; 9 and for the 3 months next preceding the time of this person's election shall have been, 10 and, during the period for which elected, shall continue to be a resident in the district 11 which that person represents.

12 **Constitution, Art. IV, Pt. Second, §6** is amended to read:

13 **Section 6. Qualifications.** The Senators shall be 25 <u>21</u> years of age at the 14 commencement of the term, for which they are elected, and in all other respects their 15 qualifications shall be the same as those of the Representatives.

17 **Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date.** 18 **Resolved:** That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their 19 respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for 20 holding a statewide election, at a statewide election held in the month of November 21 following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment 22 proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to lower the age
requirement for State Senators from 25 to 21 years of age and to lower
the age requirement for State Representatives from 21 to 18 years of
age?"

27 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding 28 square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and 29 30 declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall 31 32 review the returns. If it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment 33 34 becomes part of the Constitution of Maine on the date of the proclamation; and be it 35 further

36 Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State
 37 shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies
 38 of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

2 3 4	This resolution proposes a constitutional amendment to provide for lowering the age requirements to serve in the Maine House of Representatives from 21 to 18 years of age and to serve in the Maine Senate from 25 to 21 years of age.
