1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §264** is enacted to read:

3 **§264. Professional development**

4 **1. Fund.** The Fund for Professional Development in Education, referred to in this
5 section as "the fund," is established for the purpose of providing funding to school
6 administrative units to cover a portion of the cost of professional development for
7 teachers and other education professionals.

8 **2. Professional development opportunities.** The commissioner shall establish a
9 system to support school administrative units in the provision of up to 10 days per year of
10 professional development for teachers and other education professionals. The system
11 must:

12 **A.** Include a process for school administrative units to request from the
13 commissioner funding from the fund to cover the cost of professional development
14 for teachers and other education professionals; and

15 **B.** Provide that the commissioner shall approve funding from the fund to a school
16 administrative unit that demonstrates that:

17 (1) The professional development activities for which funding is requested will
18 improve the ability of teachers and other education professionals in the school
19 administrative unit to teach or provide other educational services for students in
20 the school administrative unit's schools;

21 (2) The school administrative unit will cover from local funds at least 50% of the
22 cost of the professional development for which funding is requested; and

23 (3) The school administrative unit has entered into an agreement with teachers
24 and other education professionals in the school administrative unit regarding the
25 purpose, dates, times and program components of the professional development
26 activities for which funding is sought.

27 **Sec. 2. Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and
28 allocations are made.

30 **Professional Development 0859**

31 Initiative: Provides ongoing funds to school administrative units for a portion of the cost

SUMMARY

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This bill establishes the Fund for Professional Development in Education with an appropriation of \$2,000,000 to support up to 50% of the cost of up to an additional 10 days annually of professional development for teachers and other education professionals. The fund is administered by the Commissioner of Education, who must approve funding if a school administrative unit demonstrates that the professional development for which funding is requested will improve teaching or educational services provided to students, the school administrative unit will provide at least 50% of the funding and the school administrative unit has entered into an agreement with the teachers regarding the timing and components of the professional development activities.
