Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 24-A MRSA §4349, sub-§7 is enacted to read:

7. Covered persons using mail order pharmacy. If a covered person is using a mail order pharmacy, the pharmacy benefits manager shall allow for the dispensing of the covered person's prescriptions at a network pharmacy under the following circumstances to ensure that the covered person has access to prescription drugs:

A. If the prescription is delayed by more than one day after the expected delivery date provided by the mail order pharmacy; or

B. If the prescription drug arrives in an unusable condition.

SUMMARY

This bill requires pharmacy benefits managers to allow for the dispensing of a covered person's prescriptions at a network pharmacy if the prescription is delayed by more than one day after the expected delivery date provided by a mail order pharmacy or if the prescription drug arrives in an unusable condition.
