1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 24-A MRSA §4349, sub-§7** is enacted to read:

3 **7. Covered persons using mail order pharmacy.** If a covered person is using a mail
4 order pharmacy, the pharmacy benefits manager shall allow for the dispensing of the
5 covered person's prescriptions at a network pharmacy under the following circumstances
6 to ensure that the covered person has access to prescription drugs:

7 A. If the prescription is delayed by more than one day after the expected delivery date
8 provided by the mail order pharmacy; or

9 B. If the prescription drug arrives in an unusable condition.

10 **SUMMARY**

11 This bill requires pharmacy benefits managers to allow for the dispensing of a covered
12 person's prescriptions at a network pharmacy if the prescription is delayed by more than
13 one day after the expected delivery date provided by a mail order pharmacy or if the
14 prescription drug arrives in an unusable condition.
