23 24 25 26 27	This amendment replaces the bill but addresses the same issue as the bill, which is to allow a vote that is less than unanimous to make changes to a condominium declaration. The amendment, modeled on a law in Washington, requires the approval of all of the owners of the units particularly affected, as well as the approval of 90% of the owners of the total number of units, rather than 100%.
