- 6 §2132. Health Care Employment for Military Veterans Program

1. Establishment; purpose. The department shall, using existing resources and
 available grant funding, establish and implement in accordance with this section the
 Health Care Employment for Military Veterans Program to assist eligible veterans who
 desire to obtain employment in civilian health care occupations in the State.

11 2. Evaluation of military health care occupational specialties. The department, in 12 implementing the program, shall create a document, referred to in this subsection as "the military-to-civilian crosswalk," that describes the military training and experience that 13 14 members of the United States Armed Forces, the National Guard of any state or the 15 Reserves of the United States Armed Forces are required to complete to engage in various military health care occupational specialties and compares that required military training 16 17 and experience with the education and training requirements for equivalent or similar 18 civilian health care occupations in this State. The military-to-civilian crosswalk must 19 include information to assist eligible veterans, occupational licensing boards and 20 postsecondary education institutions in the State in determining:

- 21A. The gaps that exist between the military training and experience obtained by22individuals who served in specific military health care occupational specialties and23the education and experience required to obtain national certification in equivalent or24similar civilian health care occupations; and
- B. The gaps that exist between the military training and experience obtained by
 individuals who served in specific military health care occupational specialties and
 the education and experience required to obtain any required licensure or certification
 to perform an equivalent or similar civilian health care occupation in this State.
- 29 3. Direct assistance to eligible veterans. The department, in implementing the
 30 program, shall provide direct assistance to eligible veterans. The department shall:
- A. Assist eligible veterans in compiling comprehensive portfolios of their military
 training and experience;
- B. Collaborate with postsecondary education institutions in the State to assist eligible
 veterans in receiving academic credit for experience, education and training the
 eligible veterans obtained during military service; and
- 36 C. Advocate for eligible veterans who request assistance in enrolling in
 37 postsecondary education programs in the State or in securing employment in a health
 38 care occupation in the State.
- 4. Coordination with the Maine Apprenticeship Program. The department shall
 40 ensure collaboration between the program and the Maine Apprenticeship Program,
 41 established in section 3202, to recruit employers in the State to sponsor eligible veterans
 42 to serve as apprentices in health care occupations.

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5. Priority. If the number of eligible veterans seeking assistance from the program 1 exceeds the capacity of the program, the program shall give priority to eligible veterans 2 3 who were discharged or released from military service no longer than 2 years prior to 4 seeking assistance.'

SUMMARY

6 This amendment strikes and replaces the bill. The amendment establishes the Health Care Employment for Military Veterans Program within the Department of Labor and 7 8 charges the program with creating a "military-to-civilian crosswalk" that compares the military training and experience obtained by individuals who have served in specific 9 10 military health care occupational specialties and the education and experience required to obtain national certification or state licensure or certification in equivalent or similar 11 civilian health care occupations. The program is also charged with providing direct 12 assistance to eligible veterans who seek to enroll in postsecondary education institutions 13 and obtain academic credit for their military training and experience as well as eligible 14 veterans who seek to secure an apprenticeship or employment in a health care occupation 15 in the State. The department is required to operate the program using existing resources 16 or available grant funding and, to the extent resources are limited, the program is required 17 18 to give priority to eligible veterans who were discharged or released from military service 19 no longer than 2 years prior to seeking assistance.
