### SUMMARY

This amendment eliminates from the bill language that enhances possession of synthetic hallucinogenic drugs to a Class C crime if the person has a prior conviction for any Class A, B or C offense in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 17-A. The amendment specifies that possession may be enhanced to a Class C crime if the person has one or more prior convictions for any offense under the drug laws in the Maine Criminal Code or for engaging in substantially similar conduct in another jurisdiction.
