4. Funding. This subsection governs the use of state funds for hypodermic 7 apparatus exchange programs certified pursuant to this section. This subsection is not 8 intended to limit the ability of certified programs to secure other sources of funding or to 9 discourage fund-raising for the purpose of operating such programs. The For any funds 10 appropriated for new and existing contracts for hypodermic apparatus exchange 11 programs, the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention shall allocate any funds 12 appropriated for hypodermic apparatus exchange programs among new and existing 13 certified programs based on provide for a competitive bidding process to allocate the 14 15 funds for contracts of \$50,000 or more and provide for an application process to allocate the funds for contracts of less than \$50,000. 37 SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the unanimous report of the committee, removes the sections of the bill that decriminalize the crimes of furnishing or possessing hypodermic

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apparatuses. It removes the changes to the requirement to distribute educational materials. It removes the requirement to distribute naloxone hydrochloride and other safer drug use supplies. Instead of requiring that a hypodermic apparatus exchange program have a board, the amendment requires a program to have a process or system to regularly seek input from persons with a history of drug use. The amendment also makes changes to the allocation of funds appropriated for hypodermic apparatus exchange programs. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.
