It provides that the annual report on the performance of the Child Development Services System within the Department of Education submitted to the Legislature by the 4 director of early childhood special education must also be submitted to the joint standing 5 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters. 6 7 2. It provides that the following data for eligible children who received services must 8 be included in the annual report on the performance of the Child Development Services 9 System submitted to the Legislature: 10 A. The number of children who received direct services in the prior year who were born in Maine and the number of children who received direct services in the prior 11 year who were born in Maine and who were delivered at home; 12 13 B. The total number of children who were referred in the prior year for support 14 outside of the Child Development Services System and the number of children who received direct services in the prior year who were referred for support outside of the 15 Child Development Services System; and 16 17 C. The number of children who received direct services in the prior year who 18 received all of the services in their individualized family service plan or 19 individualized education program and the number of children who received direct services in the prior year who received less than 90% of the services in their 20 21 individualized family service plan or individualized education program. 22 It provides that the statistics and analysis on the performance of the Child 23 Development Services System submitted to the Legislature must also include the average 24 age, both in aggregate and by primary disability type, at which children who were born in 25 Maine began receiving services from the Child Development Services System and the 26 average age, both in aggregate and by primary disability type, at which children who 27 were born in Maine and who were delivered at home began receiving services from the Child Development Services System. 28 29 4. It provides that the annual report on the performance of the Child Development Services System submitted to the Legislature must also include a report by each regional 30 site that demonstrates the trends of the Child Development Services System employee 31 costs and the results of efforts undertaken by the Child Development Services System to 32 33 coordinate with other entities and maximize the use of a broad base of community 34 resources, including private providers and public schools, midwives, resources from other agencies and other resources serving families and children from birth to under 6 years of 35 36 age.
