## An Act To Restrict Swim Areas

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. $\mathbf{1 2}$ MRSA $\S 1900$, sub- $\S 1, \llbracket[B-1$ is enacted to read:
B-1. "Entire length of the shore frontage" means the horizontal distance measured in a straight line between the 2 points at which the property lines of a property intersect with a shoreline.

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA $\S 1900$, sub- $\S 4$, as enacted by PL 2009 , c. 312 , $\S 1$, is amended to read:
4. Issuance of permit. The director may issue a permit only to a qualified entity to establish and maintain a developed swim area or a swim line within the water safety zone designed to provide recreational swimming opportunities for the public.

Sec. 3. $\mathbf{1 2}$ MRSA $\S \mathbf{1 9 0 0}$, sub- $\S 8$ is enacted to read:
8. Length of swim area. The director may not issue a permit under subsection 4 for a swim line or a developed swim area unless the length of the developed swim area or of the area delineated by a swim line is equal to or less than $50 \%$ of the entire length of the shore frontage of the property from which the developed swim area or the area delineated by a swim line extends or 200 feet, whichever is greater. The length of a developed swim area or of an area delineated by a swim line is measured parallel to the shore.

## SUMMARY

This bill provides that the Director of the Bureau of Parks and Lands within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry may not issue a permit for a swim area the length of which, measured parallel to the shore, is more than $50 \%$ of the length of the shore frontage of the property from which the swim area extends or 200 feet, whichever is greater.
