2	Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and			
3 4	Whereas, Maine driver's licenses are no longer acceptable proof for admission to federal facilities outside the State; and			
5 6	Whereas, veterans who are Maine residents are unable to access needed health care at New Hampshire veterans' medical facilities; and			
7 8 9 10	Whereas, for those Maine resident veterans who reside near the border of New Hampshire, this restriction results in those veterans having to drive or be transported many more miles, which could result in their not getting the medical attention they need; and			
11 12 13 14	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
