#### 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. Work group established. The office of aging and disability services within the Department of Health and Human Services shall convene a work group to 3 research food access barriers, both regionally and statewide, and make recommendations 4 5 about how to leverage resources to ensure regular, adequate nutrition for homebound individuals in the State and to forecast future demand and identify the appropriate level of 6 funding in the future. The office shall report to the Joint Standing Committee on Health 7 and Human Services by November 1, 2019. The joint standing committee may report out 8 a bill to the Second Regular Session of the 129th Legislature related to the report. 9
