1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §10257, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 414, Pt. A, §2 and affected
by Pt. D, §7 and c. 614, §9, is amended to read:

4 §10257. Lake and River Protection Fund

5 1. Fund established. The Lake and River Protection Fund, referred to in this section 6 as the "fund," is established within the department as a nonlapsing fund. The fund must 7 be administered by the commissioner. The fund is funded from fees collected for lake 8 and river protection stickers issued under section 13058, subsection 3 and from other funds accepted for those purposes by the commissioner or allocated or appropriated by 9 the Legislature. Money in the fund may be used for enforcing laws pertaining to invasive 10 aquatic plants and nuisance species, inspecting watercraft for invasive aquatic plant and 11 12 nuisance species materials, educational and informational efforts targeted at invasive aquatic plant and nuisance species prevention, eradication and management activities and 13 the production and distribution of lake and river protection stickers required under section 14 15 13058, subsection 3. For purposes of this section, "nuisance species" has the same meaning as in Title 38, section 1861, subsection 2. 16

17 Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §10263 is enacted to read:

18 §10263. Moose Research Fund

19 The Moose Research Fund, referred to in this section as "the fund," is established 20 within the department as a nonlapsing fund to be used by the commissioner to fund or assist in funding the research and the management of moose. Revenue from the sale of 21 22 any moose hunting permits issued by the commissioner under section 11154, subsection 23 2-A must be deposited in the fund. The commissioner may accept and deposit into the fund monetary gifts, donations or other contributions from public or private sources for 24 25 the purposes specified in this section. The fund must be held separate and apart from all 26 other money, funds and accounts.

27 Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §11154, sub-§2-A is enacted to read:

28 2-A. Additional permits. In addition to moose hunting permits issued under
 29 subsection 2, and subject to the requirements of subsection 2, the commissioner may
 30 issue moose hunting permits to fund moose research and management activities; the
 31 revenue from these permits must be deposited into the Moose Research Fund established
 32 in section 10263.

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SUMMARY

This bill adds language concerning nuisance species to the law concerning the Lake and River Protection Fund in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12 to be consistent with similar laws in Title 38.

1	The bill establishes a fund for moose management and research, funded by the
2	issuance of extra moose hunting permits, and authorizes the Commissioner of Inland
3	Fisheries and Wildlife to issue additional permits for this fund.
